
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ECONOMY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that, in light of the
2 State's ongoing recovery from the coronavirus disease 2019
3 pandemic, the State must improve its economic coordination and
4 focus its efforts to meet specific state goals in the areas of
5 economic disaster mitigation and economic diversification.

6 Accordingly, this Act is intended to help meet this need by
7 establishing a policy matrix that will ensure economic success
8 and meet the State's strategic economic diversification goals.
9 The legislature finds that the implementation of this matrix
10 will not require a significant additional investment in overhead
11 resources but will require funds for specific programs that are
12 identified collaboratively by the legislature and the department
13 of business, economic development, and tourism. The
14 implementation will also require the establishment of specific
15 goals and reports to the legislature that assess the
16 effectiveness of the projects in meeting those goals.



1 The legislature finds that through this Act, the department
2 of business, economic development, and tourism will serve as a
3 facilitative catalyst for the State, the counties, businesses,
4 investors, labor organizations, and communities and will help to
5 align the State with the emerging knowledge-based,
6 zero-emission, and digital global economy while putting Hawaii
7 on the path toward economic prosperity. Finally, the
8 legislature finds that this Act will serve as a model for the
9 creation and implementation of future public policy frameworks
10 for the State.

11 The purpose of this Act is to promote economic recovery and
12 diversification by:

- 13 (1) Establishing state goals for economic disaster
14 mitigation and economic diversification;
- 15 (2) Appropriating moneys to the department of business,
16 economic development, and tourism to implement
17 specific projects that address those goals; and
- 18 (3) Requiring the department of business, economic
19 development, and tourism to submit annual reports to
20 the legislature that summarize:



1 (A) The progress of projects assigned to the
2 department by this Act;

3 (B) The outcomes of the projects assigned to the
4 department, including an assessment of each
5 project's effectiveness in achieving state goals;
6 and

7 (C) Any other findings and recommendations, including
8 any proposed legislation.

9 SECTION 2. (a) The legislature declares that the projects
10 for which funds are appropriated pursuant to section 3 of this
11 Act align with one or more of the following goals that address
12 economic disaster mitigation and economic diversification:

13 (1) Economic disaster mitigation: Projects shall address
14 economic disaster mitigation by strengthening
15 infrastructure to better serve the community's
16 well-being and by empowering community-based planning
17 and development;

18 (2) Economic diversification through participation in the
19 digital economy: Projects shall address economic
20 diversification by strengthening Hawaii's
21 participation in the digital economy, including:



- 1 (A) Strengthening broadband infrastructure and
2 affordability;
3 (B) Increasing digital literacy;
4 (C) Strengthening remote work infrastructure; and
5 (D) Strengthening business capacity and readiness to
6 participate in the digital economy; and

7 (3) Economic diversification through strengthened trade
8 activities: Projects shall address economic
9 diversification by strengthening traded activities
10 that redistribute Hawaii's gross domestic product,
11 including:

- 12 (A) Increasing the export of professional services;
13 (B) Increasing the export of creative intellectual
14 property;
15 (C) Strengthening the post-production capacity for
16 value-added agriculture and manufacturing; and
17 (D) Strengthening the attraction of film projects.

18 (b) The department of business, economic development, and
19 tourism shall implement the projects authorized or described in
20 section 3 of this Act for the purpose of meeting the goals
21 described in subsection (a); provided that the department may



1 work with any other state or county agency for the
2 implementation of the assigned projects.

3 (c) No later than twenty days prior to the convening of
4 the regular sessions of 2023, 2024, and 2025, the department of
5 business, economic development, and tourism shall submit a
6 report to the legislature that includes:

7 (1) A summary of the progress of the projects assigned to
8 the department by this Act;

9 (2) The outcomes of the projects assigned to the
10 department by this Act, including an assessment of
11 each project's effectiveness in achieving the goals
12 described in subsection (a); and

13 (3) Any findings and recommendations, including any
14 proposed legislation.

15 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
17 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for the
18 following projects:

19 (1) For the purpose of economic disaster mitigation, as
20 described in section 2(a)(1) of this Act: \$
21 for community-based economic development



1 revitalization grants to provide funding for
2 communities to hold economic development activities;
3 and

4 (2) For the purpose of economic diversification, as
5 described in section 2(a)(2) and 2(a)(3) of this Act:

6 (A) \$ for digital literacy training in
7 partnership with state libraries and Hawaii
8 Literacy;

9 (B) \$ for Instant Teams' phase 2 to increase
10 remote work opportunities for Hawaii's residents;

11 (C) \$ for remote work website business
12 resources build-out to strengthen business
13 capacity to hire Hawaii's remote workforce;

14 (D) \$ to expand creative space studio at
15 Entrepreneurs Sandbox;

16 (E) \$ for a film permitting digital system to
17 streamline the permit process; and

18 (F) \$ for a cyber leaders program to provide
19 educational and technical cybersecurity
20 assistance to local businesses to maintain
21 compliance with cybersecurity requirements.



1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
2 business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of
3 this Act.

4 SECTION 4. The appropriation made for projects authorized
5 by section 3 of this Act shall not lapse at the end of the
6 fiscal biennium for which the appropriation is made; provided
7 that all moneys from the appropriation unencumbered as of
8 June 30, 2024, shall lapse as of that date.

9 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
11 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 to
12 fund two full-time equivalent (2.0 FTE) positions at the Hawaii
13 center for advanced transportation technologies; provided that
14 should federal funds or funding from other private or public
15 sources for these positions become available, the sum
16 appropriated by this section shall be decreased by the amount of
17 the funds secured from other sources.

18 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
19 business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of
20 this Act.

21 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.



Report Title:

DBEDT; Economic Disaster Mitigation; Economic Diversification;
Report to Legislature; Hawaii Center for Advanced Transportation
Technologies; Appropriation

Description:

Establishes a public policy framework that addresses state goals in the areas of economic disaster mitigation and economic diversification. Appropriates moneys to the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism (DBEDT) to implement specific projects that address those goals. Requires DBEDT to submit annual reports to the Legislature summarizing project outcomes, including an assessment of each project's effectiveness in achieving those goals. Appropriates funds to staff the Hawaii Center for Advanced Transportation Technologies. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

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
