A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII COMMUNITY COLLEGES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the University of 2 Hawaii community colleges are a key component to the State. The 3 University of Hawaii provide essential postsecondary education and workforce development programs to prepare residents for 4 5 future careers. A University of Hawaii community college campus is located in all counties across the State, making education 6 7 accessible to Hawaii residents. As the community college system 8 plays a vital role in supporting Hawaii residents in education 9 and career development, providing the community colleges with a 10 voice at the administrative level within the University of 11 Hawaii system is a matter of statewide concern. 12 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to: (1)Require the board of regents of the University of
- 13 14 Hawaii to establish a standing committee on community 15 colleges;
- 16 (2) Require the vice president of community colleges to 17 report directly to the standing committee; and

1 (3) Provide appropriations and authorize the establishment 2 of positions under program ID University of Hawaii, 3 community colleges (UOH 800). 4 SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended by adding a new section to part IV, subpart A, 6 subdivision 1, to be appropriately designated and to read as 7 follows: 8 "§304A- Community colleges; board of regents standing 9 committee. (a) The board of regents shall establish a standing 10 committee on community colleges to examine issues regarding 11 community colleges within the University of Hawaii. 12 (b) The vice president of community colleges shall report 13 directly to the board of regents standing committee on community 14 colleges." 15 SECTION 3. Provided that out of the general revenues of 16 the State of Hawaii that are appropriated for program ID 17 University of Hawaii, community colleges (UOH 800), there is 18 appropriated the sum of \$303,000 or so much thereof as may be 19 necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for the operating expenses 20 of the culinary institute of the Pacific, including the hiring

of three permanent full-time equivalent (3.0 FTE) groundskeeper

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- 1 I positions, one permanent full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE)
- 2 custodian I position, one permanent full-time equivalent (1.0
- 3 FTE) special equipment maintenance worker position, and two
- 4 permanent full-time equivalent (2.0 FTE) security officer
- 5 positions; provided that the University of Hawaii shall raise
- 6 new moneys for the remainder of the other current expenses in
- 7 the amount of \$376,677.
- 8 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 9 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 10 SECTION 4. Provided that out of the general revenues of
- 11 the State of Hawaii that are appropriated for program ID
- 12 University of Hawaii, community colleges (UOH 800), there is
- 13 appropriated the sum of \$2,650,000 or so much thereof as may be
- 14 necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for the early college
- 15 program, including the hiring of ten permanent full-time
- 16 equivalent (10.0 FTE) campus coordinator APT positions and ten
- 17 permanent full-time equivalent (10.0 FTE) early college
- 18 counselor (faculty) positions; provided that the early college
- 19 program shall target at-promise youth with a focus on career and
- 20 technical education and workforce development.

- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
 - 2 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
 - 3 SECTION 5. Provided that out of the general revenues of
 - 4 the State of Hawaii that are appropriated for program ID
 - 5 University of Hawaii, community colleges (UOH 800), there is
 - 6 appropriated the sum of \$1,400,000 or so much thereof as may be
 - 7 necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for the Hawaii promise
 - 8 program; provided that Hawaii promise program scholarships shall
 - 9 cover not more than ninety per cent of unmet needs.
- 10 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 11 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 12 SECTION 6. Provided that out of the general revenues of
- 13 the State of Hawaii that are appropriated for program ID
- 14 University of Hawaii, community colleges (UOH 800), there is
- 15 appropriated the sum of \$385,000 or so much thereof as may be
- 16 necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for the Hawaii nutrition
- 17 employment and training program, including the hiring of five
- 18 permanent full-time equivalent (5.0 FTE) island coordinator APT
- 19 positions.
- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 21 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.

- 1 SECTION 7. Provided that out of the general revenues of
- 2 the State of Hawaii that are appropriated for program ID
- 3 University of Hawaii, community colleges (UOH 800), there is
- 4 appropriated the sum of \$146,000 or so much thereof as may be
- 5 necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for the Maui food innovation
- 6 center, including the hiring of one permanent full-time
- 7 equivalent (1.0 FTE) 11-month instructor (faculty) for food
- 8 product research and development position, one permanent full-
- 9 time equivalent (1.0 FTE) 11-month instructor (faculty) for food
- 10 manufacturing position, and one permanent full-time equivalent
- 11 (1.0 FTE) facility coordinator APT position.
- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 13 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 14 SECTION 8. Provided that out of the general revenues of
- 15 the State of Hawaii that are appropriated for program ID
- 16 University of Hawaii, community colleges (UOH 800), there is
- 17 appropriated the sum of \$1,540,000 or so much thereof as may be
- 18 necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for workforce development
- 19 programs, including the hiring of one permanent full-time
- 20 equivalent (1.0 FTE) program manager APT position, one permanent
- 21 full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) educational specialist for

- 1 student information and registration systems APT position, four
- 2 permanent full-time equivalent (4.0 FTE) educational specialist
- 3 for sector outreach APT positions, one permanent full-time
- 4 equivalent (1.0 FTE) information technology specialist for
- 5 registration system management and web applications APT
- 6 position, and one permanent full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE)
- 7 educational specialist for prior learning assessment APT
- 8 position; provided that the workforce development programs
- 9 funded by this section shall focus on non-credit workforce
- 10 training.
- 11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 12 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 13 SECTION 9. Provided that out of the general revenues of
- 14 the State of Hawaii that are appropriated for program ID
- 15 University of Hawaii, community colleges (UOH 800), there is
- 16 appropriated the sum of \$1,274,100 or so much thereof as may be
- 17 necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for campus security
- 18 officers, including the hiring of thirty-one permanent full-time
- 19 equivalent (31.0 FTE) security officer I positions.
- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 21 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.

- 1 SECTION 10. Provided that out of the general revenues of
- 2 the State of Hawaii that are appropriated for program ID
- 3 University of Hawaii, community colleges (UOH 800), there is
- 4 appropriated the sum of \$1,622,676 or so much thereof as may be
- 5 necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for the Wahiawa value-added
- 6 product development center, including the hiring of one
- 7 permanent full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) food scientist faculty
- 8 position, one permanent full-time (1.0 FTE) administrative and
- 9 fiscal support specialist APT position, two permanent full-time
- 10 equivalent (2.0 FTE) security officer positions, two permanent
- 11 full-time equivalent (2.0 FTE) building and grounds custodian
- 12 positions, one permanent full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE)
- 13 microbiologist faculty position, one permanent full-time
- 14 equivalent (1.0 FTE) high pressure processing manager APT
- 15 position, and one permanent full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE)
- 16 chemist faculty position; provided that the Wahiawa value-added
- 17 product development center shall prioritize services for
- 18 products made in or sourced from Hawaii.
- 19 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 20 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.

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- 1 SECTION 11. Provided that out of the general revenues of
- 2 the State of Hawaii that are appropriated for program ID
- 3 University of Hawaii, community colleges (UOH 800), there is
- 4 appropriated the sum of \$4,600,000 or so much thereof as may be
- 5 necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 to restore personal services
- 6 to levels of the fiscal year immediately before the fiscal year
- 7 that the coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic began.
- 8 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 9 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 10 SECTION 12. Provided that out of the general revenues of
- 11 the State of Hawaii that are appropriated for program ID
- 12 University of Hawaii, community colleges (UOH 800), there is
- 13 appropriated the sum of \$842,572 or so much thereof as may be
- 14 necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for clinical instructors for
- 15 the nursing program.
- 16 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 17 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 18 SECTION 13. Provided that out of the general revenues of
- 19 the State of Hawaii that are appropriated for program ID
- 20 University of Hawaii, community colleges (UOH 800), there is
- 21 appropriated the sum of \$645,134 or so much thereof as may be

- 1 necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for the learn and earn
- 2 program, including the hiring of four permanent full-time
- 3 equivalent (4.0 FTE) coordinator APT positions and three-tenths
- 4 of one full-time equivalent (0.3 FTE) curriculum development
- 5 faculty position; provided that the learn and earn program shall
- 6 be implemented with the hub and spoke model and shall focus on
- 7 healthcare and agriculture pathways.
- 8 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 9 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 10 SECTION 14. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 15. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

University of Hawaii; Community Colleges; Board of Regents; Standing Committee

Description:

Requires the Board of Regents of the University of Hawaii to establish a Standing Committee on Community Colleges. Requires the Vice President of Community Colleges to report directly to the Board of Regents Standing Committee. Appropriates funds to the Community Colleges for the Culinary Institute of the Pacific, the Early College Program, the Hawaii Promise Program, HINET Program, the Maui Food Innovation Center, workforce development programs, campus security officers, the Wahiawa Value-Added Product Development Center, the restoration of personal services to pre-pandemic levels, nursing program clinical instructors, and the Learn and Earn Program.
