A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NATIVE HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The departments and agencies listed in section
 2 of this Act shall provide grants to federal tax-exempt non profit organizations that have previously received government
 assistance to support their organizational mission and also
 possess at least ten years experience of providing assistance
 and support to Native Hawaiian communities.

7 The grants shall be tailored toward improving Native 8 Hawaiian communities and culture through various assistance 9 programs, including but not limited to programs that offer food 10 sustainability; development of renewable infrastructure; Native 11 Hawaiian historic preservation; development of a mill to process 12 ulu and taro; business training, entrepreneurship, and 13 mentoring; farming; education; cultural training; and 14 environmental management.

15 The grants shall be awarded in conformance with the
16 standards for the award of grants pursuant to section 42F-103,
17 Hawaii Revised Statutes.
