BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 103D-701, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 2 3 "(a) Any actual or prospective bidder, offeror, or 4 contractor who is aggrieved in connection with the solicitation 5 or award of a contract may protest to the chief procurement officer or a designee as specified in the solicitation. [Except 6 as provided in sections 103D 303 and 103D 304, a] A protest 7 8 shall be submitted in writing within five working days after the aggrieved person knows or should have known of the facts giving 9 rise thereto[; provided that a], except as provided in sections 10 103D-303 and 103D-304. A protest of an award [or proposed 11 12 award] shall [in any event] be submitted in writing within five 13 working days after the posting of award of the contract under section 103D-302 or 103D-303, if no request for debriefing has 14 15 been made, as applicable [; provided further that no]. A protest based upon the content of the solicitation shall be [considered 16
