A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII COMMUNITY COLLEGES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's community
colleges play a critical role in the economic recovery and
revitalization of the State. The community colleges support
residents by providing them with opportunities to improve their
employment prospects and developing a workforce that helps
companies and nonprofit organizations meet the community's needs
while surviving and thriving as businesses.

8 Community colleges are at the forefront of post-secondary 9 workforce development programs, both locally and across the 10 United States. Programs that are designed to positively impact 11 local employment pipelines and provide skills for students to 12 succeed in jobs that pay not just the minimum wage, but a 13 family-sustaining wage, are critical to rebuilding the post-14 pandemic economy and developing Hawaii's future workforce.

Hawaii's community college faculty and administrators work with employers, industry associations, economic development leaders, and community organizations to develop and offer

1 workforce training programs to prepare residents for current and 2 future employment opportunities, whether for initial employment, 3 advancement, continuing education, or career changes. Community 4 colleges provide workforce training through their credit-based 5 degree programs, as well as non-credit workforce training 6 programs. Hawaii's community colleges also provide 7 opportunities for residents to earn industry-recognized 8 certificates that are valued by local employers and that can 9 also be "stacked" toward higher level certificates or degrees. The purpose of this Act is to utilize the University of 10 Hawaii's community colleges as channels to assist in stimulating 11 12 and revitalizing Hawaii's economic recovery by appropriating funds for the administration, training, and student support of 13 the colleges' workforce development programs. 14 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 15 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 16 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for 17 18 the university of Hawaii community colleges' workforce 19 development programs to fund administration, training, 20 positions, and student support.
