A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOSQUITO CONTROL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that non-native
- 2 mosquitoes pose significant multi-sector threats to the State,
- 3 including negative impacts on human health, conservation,
- 4 tourism, and economics. Residents and visitors in the State
- 5 face health threats resulting from the transmission of mosquito-
- 6 borne diseases. Mosquito-borne diseases have also had a
- 7 devastating impact on Hawaii's native bird populations and
- 8 continue to be the leading driver in the ongoing extinction risk
- 9 of most of Hawaii's remaining endemic honeycreepers.
- 10 The legislature further finds that the department of land
- 11 and natural resources is involved in a multiagency mosquito
- 12 control project, along with various other state agencies,
- 13 including the departments of agriculture and health.
- 14 The purpose of this Act is to bolster the efforts by the
- 15 department of health and department of land and natural
- 16 resources to develop mosquito control measures by appropriating

- 1 funds for the establishment of one full-time equivalent planner
- 2 position in the department of land and natural resources.
- 3 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 5 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 to
- 6 establish one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) program specialist
- 7 position related to mosquito control.
- 8 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 9 land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
