SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR TO CERTIFY GOOD STANDING FOR ALL LESSEES OF STATE PUBLIC LANDS AND PROHIBIT THE STATE FROM LEASING OR RENEWING THE LEASE OF ANY PUBLIC LANDS TO ANY INDIVIDUAL, CORPORATION, OR PUBLIC AGENCY THAT HAS NOT MET ALL FINANCIAL, CONTRACTUAL, AND LEGAL OBLIGATIONS.

WHEREAS, most landlords require their tenants to be in good 1 standing, especially before renewing a lease, which includes 2 ensuring that the tenant has met all financial, contractual, and 3 legal obligations; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, standard lease agreements allow a landlord to terminate a lease when the tenant commits a crime on the 7 property; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the obligation of the lessees of state public 10 lands include paying all moneys owed to the State, carrying out 11 environmental maintenance and necessary remediations on the 12 subject lands, and refraining from criminal activity; and 13 14 WHEREAS, as a landlord, the State should ensure that all of 15 its lessees meet these financial, contractual, and legal 16 obligations, whether the lessees are private individuals, 17 corporations, or the federal government, and exercise its right 18 to terminate a lease when a lessee engages in criminal activity 19 20 on the property; and 21 WHEREAS, some existing lessees of public lands are not in 22 23 good standing with the State; and 24 25 WHEREAS, the United States Department of Defense has unmet financial and legal obligations, and pursuant to section 3 of 26 United States Public Law 81-874, the Department of Defense is 27 required to pay impact aid to offset the financial burden on the 28 29 State's public education system; and 30

WHEREAS, according to the Department of Education, the 1 federal impact aid reimbursement paid to the State for fiscal 2 year 2019 was only 12.91 percent of the total per-pupil cost of 3 4 educating eleven thousand to fourteen thousand military students, and despite the billions of dollars in federal impact 5 aid reimbursement owed, the Department of Defense continues to 6 7 lease and control large portions of Hawaii's public lands; and 8 WHEREAS, the United States Navy and Defense Logistics 9 10 Agency are not engaging in required maintenance and environmental protection efforts on state public lands, and 11 pursuant to a 2015 administrative order on consent, the Navy and 12 Defense Logistics Agency are required to carry out regular 13 inspections and repairs of the underground storage tanks at Red 14 Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility and to reimburse the Department 15 of Health for any costs the Department incurs in its maintenance 16 of the facility; and 17 18 WHEREAS, recent water contamination that is thought to be 19 traced to the Red Hill facility suggests that the Navy and 20 Defense Logistics Agency have not been performing the required 21 environmental maintenance and necessary remediations, and it is 22 23 unclear whether the Department of Health's associated costs have been reimbursed; and 24 25 26 WHEREAS, Monsanto Company has repeatedly been found guilty of criminal activity, and despite accruing more than \$20,000,000 27 28 in fines and years of probation for storing and using banned 29 pesticides on the islands of Oahu, Maui, and Molokai, Monsanto Company still holds a lease with the State for public lands; 30 now, therefore, 31

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 33 34 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Governor is 35 requested to certify good standing for all lessees of state 36 public lands and prohibit the State from leasing or renewing the 37 38 lease of any public lands to any individual, corporation, or public agency that has not met all financial, contractual, and 39 legal obligations; and 40 41
