SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE STATE HISTORIC PRESERVATION DIVISION AND THE ISLAND BURIAL COUNCILS, TO CONTRACT REVIEW OF PROPOSED AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROJECTS TO THIRD PARTY CONSULTANTS.

1 WHEREAS, the onset of the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-2 19) pandemic led to an unprecedented economic crisis that decimated Hawai'i's economy and caused its gross domestic product 3 to plummet; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the drastic decline in economic activity 6 7 disproportionately affected the State's most vulnerable populations; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, the forced shutdown of many sectors of the State's economy triggered mass layoffs and furloughs causing the State's 11 seasonally adjusted unemployment to surge from 2.4 percent in 12 March 2020 to a historical high of 22.3 percent in April 2020; 13 and 14 15 WHEREAS, record unemployment, mass layoffs and furloughs, 16 and increased daily expenses for Hawai'i residents exacerbated 17 issues already being faced by renter households due to 18 19 historically high housing cost burdens; and 20 21 WHEREAS, economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic 22 exacerbated the burden on renter households, as more than eleven thousand Hawai'i tenants fell behind on rent payments and forty 23 24 percent of rental tenants lost their jobs; and 25 WHEREAS, while the dissemination of COVID-19 vaccines has 26 27 allowed Hawai'i's economy to slowly rebound from the devastating 28 impacts of mass layoffs and economic shutdowns, data from the 29 University of Hawai'i Economic Research Organization showed that 30 the number of individuals facing homelessness will rise; and



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1 WHEREAS, the decline and cessation of COVID-19 pandemic-2 related aid, subsidies, and relief for Hawai'i's residents, 3 including renter households, will increase significant 4 challenges to households struggling to attain jobs, make 5 payments on past due rent, and return to normal life; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, in February 2022, inflation in the United States hit a record 7.5 percent, increasing the burden on Hawai'i 9 residents who are continuing to struggle from the impacts of the 10 COVID-19 pandemic; and 11 12 WHEREAS, immediate action is imperative to mitigate the 13 14 affordable housing crisis that is both ongoing and exacerbated by the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic; now, therefore, 15 16 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 17 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, the 18 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Land 19 20 and Natural Resources, through the State Historic Preservation Division, is requested to contract its review of proposed state 21 projects, projects on privately owned historic property, and 22 projects affecting historic properties to third party 23 24 consultants if the projects involve the development of affordable housing; and 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that after an initial evaluation, if 27 the Department of Land and Natural Resources is not able to 28 provide its written concurrence or non-concurrence within sixty 29 days of the filing of the request, the Department of Land and 30 31 Natural Resources is requested to contract a third-party consultant to conduct the review; and 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and 34 Natural Resources is requested to receive pre-approval of the 35 appropriate island burial council before contracting services 36 37 with a third-party consultant; and 38 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department is requested to 39 contract third-party consultants who meet the educational and 40 experiences standards and qualifications for preservation 41



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professionals as determined by the State Historic Preservation 1 Division Rules; and 2 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that third-party consultants are 4 requested to provide a recommendation to the Department of Land 5 and Natural Resources within thirty days of the filing of the 6 request with the Department of Land and Natural Resources; and 7 8 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and Natural Resources is requested to submit its findings and 10 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 11 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 12 13 the Regular Session of 2023; and 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 15 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the 16 Board of Land and Natural Resources; Administrator of the State 17 Historic Preservation Division; Island Burial Councils of 18 Hawaii, Kauai and Niihau, Maui and Lanai, Molokai, and Oahu. 19 20 21 22 OFFERED BY:
