## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES DIVISION OF BOATING AND OCEAN RECREATION, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE KANEOHE BAY REGIONAL COUNCIL, TO CONDUCT A STUDY OF COMMERCIAL ACTIVITY ON KANEOHE BAY TO QUANTIFY THE AMOUNT OF NON-PERMITTED COMMERCIAL ACTIVITY THAT IS OPERATING IN VIOLATION OF THE KANEOHE BAY MASTER PLAN.

WHEREAS, the Kaneohe Bay Master Plan was developed pursuant 1 to Act 208, Session Laws of Hawaii 1990, to establish a 2 framework for the sustainable management of Kaneohe Bay's 3 natural resources while accommodating a variety of uses; and 4 5 WHEREAS, a compromise among competing interests resulted in 6 a cap on the number of commercial enterprises and volume of 7 commercial activity that would be permitted in Kaneohe Bay; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the vision set forth by the Kaneohe Bay Master 10 Plan continues to center on the preservation and protection of 11 Kaneohe Bay's natural resources for the continued enjoyment of 12 Hawaii's people; and 13 14 WHEREAS, limits on commercial activity have been exceeded 15 by other activities not previously envisioned, and by new 16 technologies that support their proliferation; and 17 18 WHEREAS, examples of expanded commercial activity include 19 non-permitted or non-compliant boat excursions from Heeia Kea 20 Small Boat Harbor and pre-positioned kayak rentals at Heeia 21 State Park that are advertised, coordinated, and paid online; 22 now, therefore; 23 24 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 25 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, the 26 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Land 27 and Natural Resources Division of Boating and Ocean Recreation, 28



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in consultation with the Kaneohe Bay Regional Council, is requested to conduct a study of commercial activity on Kaneohe Bay to quantify the amount of non-permitted commercial activity that is operating in violation of the Kaneohe Bay Master Plan; and

7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study is also requested to 8 investigate challenges to enforcement against illegal commercial 9 activity at Kaneohe Bay and offer recommendations to improve 10 compliance with the Kaneohe Bay Master Plan; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference Bureau is requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2023; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Administrator of the
Division of Boating and Ocean Recreation and Chairperson of the
Kaneohe Bay Regional Council.
