SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING OCTOBER 3 THROUGH OCTOBER 7, 2022, AS DIGITAL INCLUSION WEEK IN THE STATE OF HAWAII.

WHEREAS, broadband services are essential infrastructure 1 2 for the twenty-first century and play an important role in providing access to knowledge and opportunities from around the 3 world: and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, digital equity ensures that all individuals and communities have the information technology capacity needed for 7 full participation in our society, democracy, and economy and is 8 necessary for civic and cultural participation, lifelong 9 learning, and access to essential services, such as 10 telemedicine, distance learning, and the workplace; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic 13 has heightened the demand for reliable, affordable internet 14 connectivity as work, education, and access to essential 15 services have shifted toward being provided online; and 16 17 WHEREAS, broadband access has been protecting public health 18 19 during the COVID-19 pandemic, while addressing socioeconomic disparities for the most vulnerable Hawaii residents who live in 20 underrepresented communities; and 21 22 WHEREAS, many rural, agricultural, and lower-income 23 communities throughout the State lack access to reliable and 24 affordable broadband due to the lack of infrastructure; 25 discrimination in investment in delivering technology and 26 technology-related services to specific areas or populations; or 27 barriers derived from socioeconomic status, education, literacy, 28 language, or disabilities; and 29 30 WHEREAS, the State is committed to promoting digital 31 inclusion to ensure that all individuals and communities, 32

including the most remote and disadvantaged, have access to and 1 the use of information and communication technologies, including 2 affordable, robust broadband internet service; internet-enabled 3 devices that meet the needs of the user; access to digital 4 5 literacy training; quality technical support; and applications and online content designed to enable and encourage self-6 sufficiency, participation, and collaboration; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, in his State of the State address on January 25, 2021, Governor David Ige called for the State to expand its 10 investments in digital technology of Hawaii 2.0, thereby 11 dedicating the State to being a leader in broadband access; and 12 13 WHEREAS, Act 225, Regular Session of 2021, established the 14 Hawaii Broadband and Digital Equity Office and the Broadband 15 Infrastructure Grant Program to facilitate the deployment of the 16 17 infrastructure necessary to provide broadband service to unserved and underserved areas of the State; and 18 19 WHEREAS, to raise awareness of the need for digital equity 20 and to promote digital inclusion, Senate Resolution No. 49, 21 S.D. 1, Regular Session of 2021, further recognized October 4 22 through October 8, 2021, as Digital Inclusion Week in the State; 23 24 and 25 WHEREAS, Digital Inclusion Week is spearheaded by the 26 National Digital Inclusion Alliance, which represents affiliated 27 organizations working toward digital equity by crafting, 28 identifying, and disseminating financial and operational 29 resources for digital inclusion programs to raise awareness of 30 solutions addressing home internet access, personal devices, and 31 32 local technology training and support programs; now, therefore, 33 34 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, the 35 36 House of Representatives concurring, that October 3 through October 7, 2022, is recognized as Digital Inclusion Week in the 37 State to raise awareness of the need for digital equity and to 38 39 promote digital inclusion; and 40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 41 42 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor; Director
