## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU TO ESTABLISH A POLICE STATION IN LEEWARD OAHU TO PROVIDE ENHANCED POLICE SERVICES AND IMPROVED LAW ENFORCEMENT RESPONSE FOR LEEWARD OAHU COMMUNITIES.

WHEREAS, the jurisdiction of the Honolulu Police Department 1 includes the entire island of Oahu, which has an estimated 2 3 resident and military personnel population of nearly 964,000 according to State of Hawaii Data Book 2020 data; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the Honolulu Police Department is comprised of 6 eight patrol districts and twenty-nine divisions that serve 7 8 Oahu; and 9 WHEREAS, Honolulu Police Department district stations are 10 located in Kalihi, Kaneohe, Kapolei, Pearl City, and Wahiawa, 11 with police substations located in Chinatown, Kahuku, Kailua, 12 Waianae, and Waikiki; and 13 14 WHEREAS, a significant percentage of Oahu's population 15 reside in Leeward Oahu, which includes the communities of 16 Waipahu, Ewa, and Nanakuli, to the coast of Maili, Waianae, and 17 18 Makaha; and 19 WHEREAS, according to statistics from the 2020 State of 20 21 Hawaii Data Book, populations in the Leeward Oahu communities rose between 2015-2019, when compared to the 2010 populations of 22 those communities; and 23 24 WHEREAS, besides serving the needs of the Leeward Oahu 25 resident population, the workload of Honolulu Police Department 26 District 8 is also amplified by residents and visitors who are 27 28 drawn to the sunny and relaxed atmosphere of these close-knit residential communities; attractions of Yokohama Bay, Makaha 29

Beach, and Kaena Point; luxurious amenities of world-class 1 resorts; thrilling experience of a water park; and enjoyment of 2 a luau dining experience; and 3 4 WHEREAS, Honolulu Police Department Crimemapping Data 5 indicates that Honolulu Police Department District 8, which 6 covers the communities of Ewa, Ewa Beach, West Loch, Barbers 7 Point, Kapolei, Makakilo, Campbell Industrial Park, Honokai 8 Hale, Ko Olina, Nanakuli, Maili, Waianae, Makaha, Makua, and 9 Kaena, responds to an array of calls that include assaults, 10 burglaries, drug and alcohol violations, homicides, motor 11 vehicle theft, sex crimes, vandalism, and disturbing the peace; 12 13 and 14 WHEREAS, furthermore, recent news reports indicate that 15 business owners in Kapolei, Honolulu, and other areas have 16 become victims of a rash of thefts and burglaries; and 17 18 WHEREAS, this increased criminal activity has prompted 19 calls for a greater police presence and a better law enforcement 20 21 response; and 22 WHEREAS, police officers are also responding to a greater 23 number of incidents involving persons who are homeless: the 24 2020 Oahu Point in Time Count indicates that the Ewa/Kapolei 25 region and Waianae Coast region have some of the highest 26 percentages of unsheltered populations on Oahu; and 27 28 WHEREAS, the law enforcement needs of a growing Leeward 29 Oahu population call for an additional police station within 30 Honolulu Police Department District 8, which will provide 31 improved police response and other services to the Leeward Oahu 32 communities; now, therefore, 33 34 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 35 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, the 36 House of Representatives concurring, that the City and County of 37 Honolulu is urged to establish a police station in Leeward Oahu 38 39 to provide enhanced police services and improved law enforcement 40 response for Leeward Oahu communities; and 41
