SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF TAXATION TO CONDUCT A STUDY TO DETERMINE THE POTENTIAL NEW REVENUE FOR THE STATE RESULTING FROM A TAX ON ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICES.

1 2 3	WHEREAS, in recent years, self-reported cigarette smoking has declined among youth and adults, while e-cigarette use has increased; and
4 5 6 7 8	WHEREAS, between November 2016 and August 2019, total e- cigarette sales in the United States increased nearly three hundred percent; and
9 10 11 12 13	WHEREAS, because flavored e-cigarettes can be imported into the State, any state laws or regulations banning flavored e- cigarettes must be contingent on the passing of federal legislation; and
14 15 16 17 18	WHEREAS, there appears to be a disparity between the tax treatment of cigarettes, cigars, and other tobacco products versus e-cigarettes and other forms of electronic smoking devices, resulting in an economic incentive to purchase e- cigarettes and other forms of electronic smoking devices; and
19 20 21 22	WHEREAS, taxes on tobacco products have historically been used to raise revenues for the State; now, therefore,
23 24 25 26 27 28 29	BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Taxation is requested to conduct a study to determine the potential new revenue for the State resulting from a tax on electronic smoking devices; and

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Taxation is 1 requested to submit a report of its findings and 2 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 3 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 4 the Regular Session of 2023; and 5 6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 7 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of 8 Taxation. 9 10 11 12 OFFERED BY:
