SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE HAWAII PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION TO DEVELOP AN EFFICIENT AND STREAMLINED PROCESS FOR REVIEWING ELECTRIC UTILITIES' REQUESTS TO PROVIDE "MIDDLE MILE" BROADBAND SERVICES IN SUPPORT OF EXPANDING BROADBAND SERVICES FOR HAWAII RESIDENTS IN UNDERSERVED AND UNSERVED AREAS.

1 WHEREAS, over the past two years, the coronavirus disease 2 2019 pandemic has transformed the lives of citizens of the State 3 and beyond, and revealed the importance of broadband equity to 4 ensure fair access to telework, telemedicine, and remote 5 learning opportunities for the people of Hawaii; and

7 WHEREAS, concurrently, electric utilities across the United 8 States are increasingly reliant on telecommunications 9 infrastructure to support modern grid operations and manage 10 increasing volumes of distributed energy resources, which 11 requires that electric utilities modernize their grids to 12 include robust and diverse telecommunications infrastructure to 13 all grid assets at the edge of every community; and 14

WHEREAS, the State's regulated electric utilities are wellpositioned to help bridge the digital divide by leveraging excess capacity on that same utility telecommunications infrastructure to provide "middle mile" broadband services that can enable internet service providers to offer services to communities that are otherwise cost-prohibitive to reach; and

22 WHEREAS, this represents a commonsense approach to 23 addressing the digital divide, presenting an additional approach 24 for internet service providers to offer broadband in low to 25 moderate income, hard-to-reach communities; and

WHEREAS, the expansion of broadband services aligns with
the State's current efforts to expedite the deployment of
broadband, as well as the national trend of related legislation;
and

32 WHEREAS, the National Association of Regulatory Utility 33 Commissioners issued a resolution, on November 9, 2021, that



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underscores the importance of electric utilities' active 1 participation in broadband expansion through utilization of 2 existing telecommunication infrastructure; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the Public Utilities Commission's development of 5 an expedited process would help address the growing need for 6 access to broadband and enable equitable access to telework, 7 telemedicine, remote learning, and participation in the digital 8 9 economy; and 10 WHEREAS, existing regulated public utilities are able to 11 provide foundational, diverse middle mile broadband services to 12 internet service providers and other third parties without 13 14 duplicating efforts, congesting rights-of-way or view planes; 15 and 16 WHEREAS, this allows electric utilities and internet 17 18 service providers to partner together; and 19 WHEREAS, the Public Utilities Commission and the Consumer 20 Advocate are authorized under sections 269-39, 269-51, and 269-21 54, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to provide regulatory oversight 22 over electric utilities to ensure that, among other things, an 23 electric utility does not favor itself or its affiliates, it 24 does not cross-subsidize any of its activities with ratepayers' 25 funds, and provides maximum value to the ratepayer, ensuring 26 that no electric service rates include funding for facilities 27 beyond that which is reasonably required for the provision of 28 electric service; and 29 30 WHEREAS, in conjunction with the Federal Communications 31 Commission's authority and the Federal Pole Attachment Act, the 32 Public Utilities Commission also exercises authority over 33 electric utilities that own distribution poles, requiring that 34 they provide non-discriminatory access to their poles and comply 35 with the strict federal timelines and federal rules and 36 37 regulations governing pole attachments; and 38 39 WHEREAS, the Legislature supports electric utilities' ability to provide middle mile broadband service using the 40 excess capacity of their electrical service infrastructure to 41



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1	internet service providers and other third parties; now,
2	therefore,
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4	BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first
5	Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022,
6 7	that the Public Utilities Commission is urged to consider and adopt an efficient, streamlined process to review requests made
8	by electric utilities under section 269-19, Hawaii Revised
9	Statutes, to provide middle mile broadband services in
10	furtherance of the State's efforts to expedite broadband access
11	and equity and to facilitate digital equity and promote
12	expeditious broadband deployment to areas of the State that are
13	unserved and underserved; and

15	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
16	Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Public
17	Utilities Commission; Executive Director of the Division of
18	Consumer Advocacy; Director of Business, Economic Development,
19 20	and Tourism; President and Chief Executive Officer of the
20	Hawaiian Electric Company, Inc.; and Chair of the Board of
21 22	Directors of the Kauaʻi Island Utility Cooperative.
