SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO DEVELOP A FILIPINO HISTORY, CULTURE, AND IDENTITY SOCIAL STUDIES COURSE FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS.

WHEREAS, in 2020, news reports indicated that anti-Asian 1 hate crimes had increased nearly one hundred fifty percent in 2 the United States; and 3 4 WHEREAS, research on the use of racist language shows that 5 language does have a profound impact on how people behave 6 towards marginalized groups; and 7 8 WHEREAS, increased education and understanding of Asian-9 American history and culture, and the contributions of Asian-10 Americans can reduce incidents of hostility, violence, and 11 discrimination toward Asian Americans; and 12 13 WHEREAS, there is currently no mandated curriculum 14 regarding Asian American history in Hawaii schools; and 15 16 17 WHEREAS, throughout the United States, there have been recent attempts to pass legislation relating to Asian American 18 history; and 19 20 WHEREAS, Filipinos are the largest Asian ethnic and non-21 white group in Hawaii, at more than twenty-five per cent of the 22 population, and have had a long presence and cultural footprint 23 in the State; and 24 25 WHEREAS, despite twenty-three per cent of Hawaii's public-26 school students being Filipino, the largest ethnic group in the 27 Hawaii education system, there is a lack of Filipino 28 representation in the education system; and 29 30 WHEREAS, Filipino educators are underrepresented in higher 31 education and grades kindergarten through twelve, with Filipino 32



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teachers representing eight percent of the teaching force and 1 2 five percent of administration; and 3 4 WHEREAS, when students are represented, they feel a stronger ethnic pride and identity, and are more empowered to 5 positively contribute to their communities; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, research shows that when there is a family-school connection, teacher-student ethnicity match, culturally and 9 linguistically responsive curriculum, and language programs 10 where students' multilingual assets are utilized, students are 11 more engaged and connected to their learning, resulting in 12 13 higher levels of academic performance; now, therefore, 14 15 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 16 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, that the Department of Education is requested to develop a 17 social studies course for high school students to learn about 18 Filipino history, culture, and identity; and 19 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is requested to develop Filipino content that may be integrated 22 into Department of Education content performance standards; and 23 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is requested to develop this curriculum so that it may be 26 27 incorporated into existing Filipino language classes and other courses and curricula, including language arts, math, social 28 studies, science, and visual and performing arts; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 31 32 requested to recruit Filipino teachers and support Filipino 33 teachers to teach this course; and 34 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of 36 37 Education and Superintendent of Education.
