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SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ADOPTION OF A STATE POLICY ASSURING THAT SAVINGS REALIZED BY THE STATE THROUGH THE EXTENSION OF FEDERAL MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PERCENTAGE PAYMENTS OF ONE HUNDRED PERCENT FOR NATIVE HAWAIIAN HEALTH CARE SYSTEMS IS USED TO ADDRESS HEALTH DISPARITIES EXPERIENCED BY HAWAIIAN COMMUNITIES.

WHEREAS, Papa Ola Lokahi is a Hawaii nonprofit corporation, 1 501(c)(3) public charity, and consortium of public agencies and 2 private nonprofit organizations concerned with improving Native 3 Hawaiian cultural, physical, mental, and spiritual health and 4 well-being, including by entering into agreements or memoranda 5 of understanding with relevant organizations that are capable of 6 providing resources or services to the Native Hawaiian health 7 care systems that serve the unique health needs of Hawaiian 8 communities; and 9

WHEREAS, AHARO Hawaii (AHARO) is a Hawaii nonprofit 11 corporation, 501(c)(3) public charity, and consortium of Hawaii 12 nonprofit corporations each of which is a 501(c)(3) public 13 charity and federally qualified community health center that has 14 demonstrated records of contributing to the health and well-15 being of Native Hawaiians and providing a wide range of 16 culturally-sensitive, holistic, and primary care health services 17 to predominately rural, multi-generational Native Hawaiian 18 communities in medically underserved areas within the State of 19 20 Hawaii; and

WHEREAS, AHARO is currently comprised of five federally qualified health center organizations: Bay Clinic, Inc.; Hamakua Health Center, Inc.; Molokai Ohana Health Care, Inc. (dba Molokai Community Health Center); Waianae District Comprehensive Health and Hospital Board, Inc. (dba Waianae Coast Comprehensive Health Center); and Waimanalo Health Center; and 28

services and an AHARO member organization has established a 1 Kupuna Council of traditional Hawaiian healers recognized by 2 Papa Ola Lōkahi which distinguishes practitioners of Hawaiian 3 healing traditions from medical clinicians in Hawaii and 4 provides for the protection and preservation of such healing 5 practices as assured by the Hawaii State Constitution; and 6 7 WHEREAS, under section 9815 of the American Rescue Plan Act 8 9 of 2021 ("ARPA"), the federal government will pay one hundred percent of the cost of Medicaid services provided at Native 10 Hawaiian Health Centers for eight fiscal year quarters (which 11 may be extended); and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, Papa Ola Lōkahi and AHARO have agreed that AHARO member health centers will serve as additional "Native Hawaiian 15 Health Centers" and are recognized as part of the federal effort 16 17 to address health disparities experienced by Native Hawaiians; 18 and 19 WHEREAS, the current limited QUEST dental program does not 20 address the needs in multi-generational Hawaiian communities 21 22 where extensive dental work is needed; and 23 WHEREAS, full adult dental services are a required service 24 of a federally qualified health center and are typically 25 supported through state match; and 26 27 WHEREAS, state savings, realized from the Native Hawaiian 28 Federal Medical Assistance Percentage recalculation, should be 29 used to address continuing health disparities realized by Native 30 Hawaiians which include dental disease and the early onset of 31 32 chronic diseases; and 33 34 WHEREAS, these supplemental healthcare services should be provided by healthcare providers authorized by Papa Ola Lokahi; 35 36 now, therefore, 37 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 38 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, 39 that all executive departments are requested to review their 40 policies and prioritize the goal of the adoption of a state 41 policy assuring that savings realized by the State through the 42
