SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS CORPORATION TO PARTNER WITH THE KA'Ū RURAL HEALTH COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION, INC., TO CONDUCT A NEEDS ASSESSMENT TO DETERMINE THE DEMAND FOR AND ACCESS TO URGENT CARE AND OUTPATIENT BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES IN THE KA'Ū DISTRICT.

1 WHEREAS, individuals with pre-existing mental health 2 conditions may be particularly vulnerable in an emergency, and 3 in particular, physical isolation and loneliness during the 4 coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic may present specific health 5 risks for households with adolescents and older adults; and 6

7 WHEREAS, rural health clinics address inadequate supplies 8 of physicians serving Medicaid beneficiaries in rural areas and 9 increase the availability of medically necessary, face-to-face 10 primary health services; and

12 WHEREAS, rural health clinics also provide access to 13 qualified preventative health services furnished by licensed 14 health practitioners, including physicians, nurse practitioners, 15 physical assistants, certified nurse-midwives, clinical 16 psychologists, and social workers; and

18 WHEREAS, rural health clinics serve an essential role in
19 underserved communities such as the Ka'ū district in the County
20 of Hawaii, enabling greater appointment availability for
21 Medicaid patients; and

WHEREAS, the Ka'ū Rural Health Community Association, Inc.
is a non-profit organization whose mission is to preserve access
to quality health care in rural communities in the Ka'ū district
in the County of Hawaii; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first
Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022,
that the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation is requested to
partner with the Kaʿū Rural Health Community Association, Inc.,

to conduct a needs assessment to determine the demand for and 1 access to urgent care and outpatient behavioral health services 2 in the Ka'ū district; and 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Health Systems 5 Corporation is requested to submit a report of its findings and 6 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 7 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 8 the Regular Session of 2023; and 9 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 11 Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health, Chair of 12 the Board of Directors of Hawaii Health Systems Corporation, and 13 Executive Director of Ka'û Rural Health Community Association, 14 15 Inc.
