SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND THE COUNTY OF HAWAII TO
CONDUCT A FEASIBILITY STUDY FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF AN
AMBULANCE SERVICE FOR THE TOWN OF MAKALEI IN THE COUNTY OF
HAWAII.

1 WHEREAS, the north Kona region on Hawai'i island is one of
2 the fastest growing regions in the State; and
3

4 WHEREAS, the steep increase in population in north Kona has
5 resulted in a corresponding steady increase in calls for
6 emergency medical services; and
7

8 WHEREAS, for residents of Makalei in north Kona, the
9 closest primary care services and facilities are a thirty-mile
10 drive away; and
11

12 WHEREAS, for residents in rural, isolated communities,
13 emergency medical services have become the main delivery method
14 and access to health care; and
15

16 WHEREAS, due to the lack of available health care services,
17 it is a common practice for paramedics to respond to ten or more
18 calls for emergency medical transportation during a twenty-four-
19 hour shift in north Kona; and
20

21 WHEREAS, a timely response to a 911 call is critical to
22 reduce death and disability among residents and visitors on
23 Hawai'i island; and
24

25 WHEREAS, in recent years, legislative efforts such as
26 Senate Bill No. 877 (2020) have requested funding to establish a
27 life support ambulance in Makalei; however, those efforts have
28 stalled due primarily to a lack of specific information
29 regarding costs of equipment and staffing; and

31 WHEREAS, more information is necessary to determine the
32 need and approximate cost to purchase one advanced life support
33 ambulance to be based in Makalei, as well as related personnel



1 costs for state-certified emergency medical services personnel;
2 now, therefore,
3

4 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first
5 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022,
6 that the Department of Health and the County of Hawai'i are
7 requested to conduct a feasibility study for the implementation
8 of an ambulance service for the town of Makalei in the County of
9 Hawai'i; and
10

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the feasibility study is
12 requested to include a recommendation to most efficiently
13 provide ambulance service for the town of Makalei; and
14

15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the feasibility study be
16 submitted to the Governor and Legislature no later than twenty
17 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2023; and
18

19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
20 Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health and Mayor of
21 the County of Hawai'i.
