## SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND STATE PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOL COMMISSION TO PRIORITIZE THE HIRING OF DEDICATED STAFF TO MANAGE FEDERAL SCHOOL MEAL PROGRAMS.

WHEREAS, access to school meals are an important part of a 1 child's health and well-being at school; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, certain federal programs provide aid for the provision of free and reduced meals for students, such as the 5 United States Department of Agriculture's National School Lunch 6 7 Program; and 8 9 WHEREAS, it is therefore imperative that the Department of Education and State Public Charter School Commission fully 10 utilize every federal program that provides free and reduced 11 meals for students; and 12 13 WHEREAS, the Department of Education's school foods 14 services branch, which manages the National School Lunch 15 Program, provides administrative and operational meal support 16 for public schools but not state charter schools; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, recent experiences have demonstrated that public and state charter schools in rural areas and on the neighbor 20 21 islands require additional staff to support the National School Lunch Program initiatives, promote effectiveness at the local 22 level with parents and teachers, and improve efficiency by 23 eliminating the delay in communication with pertinent school 24 personnel; and 25 26 WHEREAS, as an example, schools such as Kahakai Elementary 27 School, Kealakehe Intermediate School, and Konawaena High School 28 in the County of Hawai'i were unable to sufficiently utilize 29 30 federal school meal program benefits due to staffing shortages and considerable physical distance between school campuses; and 31 32 33 WHEREAS, the staffing and logistical challenges faced by these schools in the administration of federal school meal 34 programs have been exacerbated by federal rules that disallow or 35



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1 limit the use of volunteers and other mitigation efforts pursued by schools that lack dedicated staff to manage federal school 2 meal programs; now, therefore, 3 4 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 5 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, 6 that the Department of Education and State Public Charter School 7 Commission are urged to prioritize the hiring of dedicated staff 8 9 for each school campus to manage federal school meal programs, including the National School Lunch Program; and 10 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is requested to seek federal funding, from sources including the 13 United States Department of Agriculture, for purposes of hiring 14 15 dedicated staff for each public school campus to manage federal meal programs; and 16 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 18 19 requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 20 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 21 the Regular Session of 2023; and 22 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 24 Resolution be transmitted to the Superintendent of Education and 25 26 Executive Director of the State Public Charter School Commission. 27 28 29 30 OFFERED BY:
