SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING STATE AND COUNTY AGENCIES TO IMPLEMENT EMPLOYMENT FIRST PRINCIPLES IN HIRING PRACTICES AND ALL PROGRAMS AND SERVICES ADMINISTERED OR FUNDED BY THE STATE AND COUNTIES, INCLUDING PROGRAMS AND SERVICES THAT HELP PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES OBTAIN EMPLOYMENT.

WHEREAS, in recent years, Hawaii has made strides in 1 removing barriers to employment for persons with intellectual or 2 developmental disabilities; and 3 4 WHEREAS, by Act 155, Session Laws of Hawaii 2019 (Act 155) 5 the Legislature enacted Kal's Law, an Earned Income Disregard 6 Program allowing individuals who receive Medicaid to earn up to 7 a livable wage without losing their Medicaid services; and 8 9 WHEREAS, by Act 55, Session Laws of Hawaii 2021, the 10 Legislature repealed the law that exempted persons with 11 disabilities from minimum wage requirements; and 12 13 WHEREAS, further work can be done to assist persons with 14 disabilities who desire to join the workforce by promoting 15 policies that prioritize employment as a strategy for fuller 16 integration into the community; and 17 18 WHEREAS, employment first principles elevate employment in 19 the general workforce as the first and preferred option for 20 persons with disabilities receiving assistance from publicly 21 funded systems; and 22 23 WHEREAS, as the Legislature concluded in Act 155, "it is 24 advantageous for economic development in the State and in the 25 best interests of Hawaii's citizens with disabilities to 26 establish programs and policies that encourage their 27 employment"; now, therefore, 28 29

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, by requesting that employment 1 2 first principles be implemented, this body is not suggesting that any employer be required to give preference to hiring a 3 4 person with disabilities, nor is this body suggesting that other appropriate supported employment services be eliminated; and 5 6 7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Human 8 Services is requested to: 9 10 (1)Practice employment first principles with respect to waiver program personnel under chapter 346D, Hawaii 11 12 Revised Statutes; and 13 (2) Ensure that contracted agency providers that provide 14 services for the waiver program follow employment 15 first principles in the hiring of their employees; and 16 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director of Human 19 Services, Director of Health, Director of Labor and Industrial 20 Relations, mayor of each of the four counties, Executive 21 22 Administrator of the State Council on Developmental Disabilities, Executive Director of the Disability and 23 24 Communication Access Board, and Executive Director of the Hawaii 25 Disability Rights Center. 26 27 28
