## SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE OFFICE OF ENTERPRISE TECHNOLOGY SERVICES TO CONDUCT A FEASIBILITY STUDY ON THE DEVELOPMENT OF A STATEWIDE INTERAGENCY SYSTEM FOR FILING AND MAINTAINING DOCUMENTS REQUIRED OF INDIVIDUALS AND ORGANIZATIONS ACCESSING GOVERNMENT SERVICES ONLINE.

WHEREAS, today, many government services and programs are 1 provided online and reliance on the online method of delivery 2 has increased due to the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) 3 4 pandemic; and 5 WHEREAS, many government services and programs require 6 personal information for online access privileges and require 7 8 documentation to be uploaded in certain instances; and 9 WHEREAS, oftentimes the same information and same 10 documentation must be uploaded numerous times to access the 11 online services at different times or to access different 12 13 services; and 14 WHEREAS, this redundant input and upload exercise wastes 15 time, causes user frustration, and likely contributes to less 16 utilization of online services than would be the case if the 17 process were streamlined; and 18 19 WHEREAS, a statewide interagency system for the filing and 20 maintenance of documents required of individuals and 21 organizations accessing government services online would improve 22 efficiency and user experience; and 23 24 WHEREAS, one program that would particularly benefit from a 25 statewide interagency system for the filing and maintenance of 26 27 documents required of individuals and organizations accessing government services online is the grant-in-aid program; and 28 29 WHEREAS, other areas that could benefit from a statewide 30 interagency filing system are taxation, regulatory compliance, 31 government assistance programs, and occupational licensing; and 32 33

WHEREAS, the Judiciary, for example, has implemented a 1 statewide online filing system for nearly the entire court 2 system, including district, circuit, and appellate courts, which 3 has streamlined the process for filing and retrieving court 4 documents, lowered the barriers to accessing the courts in many 5 6 respects, and immeasurably prepared the Judiciary to deliver 7 critical services throughout the COVID-19 pandemic; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the success of the Judiciary's statewide filing system demonstrates the untold potential of a statewide 10 interagency system for the filing and maintenance of documents 11 required of individuals and organizations accessing government 12 services online; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the Office of Enterprise Technology Services 15 provides governance for executive branch information technology 16 projects and is uniquely positioned to study and implement a 17 statewide interagency filing system; now, therefore, 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 20 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, 21 that the Office of Enterprise Technology Services is requested 22 to conduct a feasibility study on the development of a statewide 23 interagency system for filing and maintaining documents required 24 25 of individuals and organizations accessing government services online; and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Office of Enterprise 28 Technology Services is requested to submit a report of its 29 findings and recommendations, including any proposed 30 legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior 31 to the convening of the Regular Session of 2023; and 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 34 Resolution be transmitted to the Office of Enterprise Technology 35 36 Services. 37 OFFERED BY: Bennette fer fusleh 38 39
