One hundred and six years later, Trinidad continues to 1 (4)hold the distinction of being the only Asian American 2 3 and only Filipino American in the United States Navy to have received a Medal of Honor; 4 5 (5) The naming of a Navy ship in honor of Trinidad would 6 demonstrate the Navy's leadership and commitment to 7 diversity, equality, and inclusion amid current racial 8 tensions and unwarranted violence against Asian 9 Americans and Pacific Islanders nationwide, and would 10 also mark the seventy-fifth anniversary of the 11 establishment of diplomatic relations between the 12 United States and the Republic of the Philippines and 13 the seventieth anniversary of the Mutual Defense 14 Treaty between the two countries; and 15 16 (6) The naming of a Navy ship after Trinidad would also 17 honor the faithful and loyal service, since 1901, of 18 tens of thousands of Filipinos and Filipino Americans 19 in the United States Navy; would result in the first-20 ever Navy ship bearing the name of an American 21 national of Filipino descent; and would evidence the 22 long-standing military and political alliance that has 23 existed between the United States and the Philippines 24 since 1898; now, therefore, 25 26 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 27 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, 28 that this body supports the naming of a United States Navy 29 surface combatant ship after Fireman Second Class and 30 Congressional Medal of Honor recipient Telesforo Trinidad; and 31 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 33 Resolution be transmitted to the Secretary of the United States 34 Navy and members of the Hawaii congressional delegation. 35
