SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF TAXATION TO CONDUCT A STUDY TO DETERMINE THE POTENTIAL NEW REVENUE FOR THE STATE RESULTING FROM A TAX ON ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICES.

WHEREAS, in recent years, self-reported cigarette smoking 1 has declined among youth and adults, while e-cigarette use has 2 3 increased; and 4 5 WHEREAS, between November 2016 and August 2019, total ecigarette sales in the United States increased nearly three 6 hundred percent; and 7 8 WHEREAS, because flavored e-cigarettes can be imported into 9 the State, any state laws or regulations banning flavored e-10 cigarettes must be contingent on the passing of federal 11 legislation; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, there appears to be a disparity between the tax treatment of cigarettes, cigars, and other tobacco products 15 versus e-cigarettes and other forms of electronic smoking 16 17 devices, resulting in an economic incentive to purchase e-18 cigarettes and other forms of electronic smoking devices; and 19 20 WHEREAS, taxes on tobacco products have historically been 21 used to raise revenues for the State; now, therefore, 22 23 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, 24 that the Department of Taxation is requested to conduct a study 25 to determine the potential new revenue for the State resulting 26 from a tax on electronic smoking devices; and 27 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Taxation is 30 requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 31

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Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2023; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Taxation. OFFERED BY:
