Your Committee on Higher Education & Technology, to which was referred H.C.R. No. 165 entitled:

"HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE OFFICE OF ENTERPRISE TECHNOLOGY SERVICES TO DEVELOP A RECOMMENDED DEFINITION FOR BLOCKCHAIN TECHNOLOGY AND RECOMMENDATIONS FOR OPPORTUNITIES FOR INDIVIDUALS, PRIVATE ENTITIES, AND STATE AGENCIES TO USE BLOCKCHAIN TECHNOLOGY,"

The purpose of this measure is to request the Office of Enterprise Technology Services to develop a recommended definition for blockchain technology and recommendations for opportunities for individuals, private entities, and state agencies to use blockchain technology.

Your Committee received comments on this measure from the Office of Enterprise Technology Services.


Your Committee finds that blockchain technology, which employs a distributed ledger format, can protect data; streamline processes; and reduce fraud, waste, and abuse while simultaneously increasing trust and accountability. Your Committee further finds that blockchain technology can be leveraged to support an array of government and public-sector applications, including land registration, identity management, supply-chain traceability,



health care, corporate registration, taxation, voting, digital currency and payments, and legal-entities management.

As affirmed by the record of votes of the members of your Committee on Higher Education & Technology that is attached to this report, your Committee concurs with the intent and purpose of H.C.R. No. 165 and recommends that it be referred to your Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.
