Your Committee on Public Safety, Intergovernmental, and
Military Affairs, to which was referred S.R. No. 167 entitled:

"SENATE RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE COUNTY OF HAWAII'S EFFORTS
TO PURSUE UNITED STATES ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS CONTINUING
AUTHORITIES PROGRAM FUNDING FOR THE RESTORATION OF KAHALU'U
BAY IN HAWAII' I ISLAND,"

begs leave to report as follows:

The purpose and intent of this measure is to support the
County of Hawaii's efforts to pursue United States Army Corps of
Engineers Continuing Authorities program funding for the
restoration of Kahaluu Bay on Hawaii Island.

Your Committee received testimony in support of this measure
from two members of the Hawai'i County Council and Kohala Center.

Your Committee finds that the Kahaluu Beach and Bay Park is
the most popular visitor destination in west Hawaii Island,
hosting 400,000 users a year due to ease of access and marine life
diversity. However, the Kahaluu Beach Park and Bay facilities are
eroding from storm surges and sea-level rise while the marine life
is threatened by both human interactions through trampling,
sunscreen exposure, and waste disposal and by ocean acidification,
ocean heating, and other climate change effects. Your Committee
believes that the pursuit of United States Army Corps of
Engineers' Continuing Authorities Program funding is critical to
the restoration of Kahaluu Beach and Bay Park on Hawaii Island.



This measure will protect the Kahaluu Beach and Bay Park by supporting the County of Hawaii's efforts to pursue United States Army Corps of Engineers Continuing Authorities program funding for the restoration of Kahaluu Bay on Hawaii Island.

As affirmed by the record of votes of the members of your Committee on Public Safety, Intergovernmental, and Military Affairs that is attached to this report, your Committee concurs with the intent and purpose of S.R. No. 167 and recommends its adoption.


