Honorable Chair Luke, Vice Chair Cullen, and Members of the House Committee on Finance:

My name is Catherine Awakuni Colón, and I am the Director of the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs (DCCA or Department). I appreciate the opportunity to discuss the Department's fiscal year (FY) 2019 budget with members of this Committee.

Overview

The Department's mission is to promote a strong and healthy business environment by upholding fairness and public confidence in the marketplace, and by increasing knowledge and opportunity for Hawaii's businesses and consumers.

The Legislature created the Compliance Resolution Fund (CRF) in 1996 to serve as the primary funding source for the DCCA. Through the CRF, the Department's divisions have revenues to pay their expenses and contribute equitably to departmental overhead costs, while maintaining sufficient reserves to address unexpected contingencies. Consistent with applicable law, the Department provisions its collected fees and revenue to deliver important services related to commerce and consumer protection. Strong fiscal oversight continues to be important despite the DCCA's financial self-sufficiency. Toward that end, I appreciate the Committee's thorough review and consideration of the Department's budget.

Impact of Current Economic and Fiscal Conditions

During FY 2019, the Department continued to address the challenges of operating in a rapidly evolving environment affected by technological advances and increased consumer needs. The DCCA divisions and attached agencies reached a number of critical decisions this past year, and the Department is working to ensure that its operational systems are supported and any backlogs are receiving due attention. This year, the Department prioritized assisting consumers recovering from major disasters; activity in communications (Hawaiian Telcom and Cincinnati Bell merger, as well as Spectrum WiFi access point designations); consumer safety prosecutions (Takata airbag case); and energy/utilities (rate cases, resource planning reviews, and performance-based ratemaking development). The divisions and agencies responsible for these matters allocated greater resources to resolving these issues while simultaneously handling their traditional regulatory responsibilities. A healthy state economy has also bolstered consumer activity and increased demand on the Department to address consumer complaints and review applications for professional and vocational licensure.

Recent political developments may result in significant changes to existing programs and legal structures, including potential overhauls of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, energy and environmental regulation, and banking and financial services regulation. The Department will continue monitoring these changes to ensure the State's businesses and consumers are not impacted negatively.

The Department continuously aims to develop a budget that addresses its essential needs, including making general cost adjustments and requesting resources that efficiently allow the DCCA to carry out its mission.

Federal Funds

None of the Department's programs have lost or are at risk of losing federal funds. One of the Department's federal grants that provide funding for work in health insurance – Grants to Support States in Health Insurance Rate Review – has been extended multiple times and is anticipated to expire on September 30, 2019, when all funds are scheduled to be exhausted.

Budget Requests

The Department formulated a budget that provides the resources necessary for our programs to perform their functions and meet their goals and objectives. Pursuant to instructions in Finance Memorandum 18-16 issued by the Department of Budget and Finance (BUF), notable requests in the current budget include:

- Increase in authorization for: one staff attorney; one administrative specialist; and three
 program specialists to meet CCA-103's (Division of Consumer Advocacy, DCA) increased
 workload and cases before the Public Utilities Commission (PUC).
- Conversion of two legal clerks and three hearings officer positions in CCA-191 (Office of Administrative Hearings, OAH) from temporary to permanent status, which is essential for the administration of contested case hearings that the OAH conducts on a regular basis. OAH currently has four hearings officers who preside over cases involving license disciplinary actions, license denials, disputes over the use of trade names and trademarks, securities violations, denials of personal injury protection benefits, violations of the laws governing the post-secondary education authorization, procurement appeals, and disputes over Employees Retirement System members' eligibility for disability retirement benefits. This generates a high volume of legal and clerical work that involves the administration, processing, and adjudicating of these cases in a timely manner. It has been difficult for OAH to fill and retain these temporary positions.
- Conversion of five investigators and three staff attorneys from temporary to permanent status in CCA-111 (Securities Enforcement Branch). The main role of these positions is to investigate and prosecute state securities law violations. The branch has experienced an increase in cases and continues to see new and complicated financial fraud schemes. These positions are needed to effectively protect the residents of Hawaii from these frauds. Having these positions converted to permanent status will help the branch maintain the institutional knowledge held by the incumbents of the positions. There would be no impact to the budget, as all positions would be removed as temporary positions but included as permanent positions for the same budgeted amount.
- Increase of \$350,000 in FY 20 and \$50,000 in FY 21 for the development, licensing, and maintenance of a new system to replace CCA-112's (Regulated Industries Complaints Office) current complaints management software. This enhancement will allow the public to file automated complaints and will also improve records maintenance, tracking and document retention, and management and management report generation.
- Increase of \$500,000 in FY 20 and \$2,060,000 in FY 21 for the development, licensing, maintenance, and independent validation and verification (IVV) of an IT solution to address shortfalls in CCA-901's Document Management System and to automate and improve workflows. This will address concerns raised in the State Auditor's Report No. 18-05, issued in February 2018, and will allow the PUC to: (1) develop and implement an IT strategy that aligns with the PUC's strategic plan and current needs and involves internal and external stakeholders, including the Consumer Advocate; and (2) complete a request for information as soon as possible to avoid additional maintenance of the current system.
- Increase of \$300,000 to design and replace CCA-105's (Professional and Vocational

- Licensing Division, PVL) Applicant/Licensee Integrated Automated System, as well as fund its recurring license and maintenance costs.
- Increase of \$40,000 to fund the recurring license and annual maintenance costs of CCA-104's (Division of Financial Institutions, DFI) regulatory IT system.
- Funding in CCA-191 (Information Systems and Communications Office, ISCO) for \$100,000 in FY 20 and \$25,000 in FY 21 for the purchase of software and recurring maintenance costs to establish a source code repository to ensure access to and avoid risks of losing source codes for both legacy and newly developed IT systems.
- Funding in CCA-105 of \$104,000 in personnel services costs to fund salary and fringe costs for the PVL to timely process physician applications by endorsement, in accordance with Act 044, Session Laws of Hawaii (SLH) 2018.
- Increase of \$200,240 in FY 20 and \$195, 840 in FY 21 for the continuance of personal services, other expenses, and equipment appropriated by Act 201, SLH 2018 for CCA-901's Consumer Affairs and Compliance section to resolve complaints for all the PUC's regulated entities. The funding for these enforcement positions will allow the PUC to increase its presence in monitoring motor carrier activity and enforce compliance with PUC laws, rules, regulations, and orders.
- Increase of \$2,500,000 in FY 20 and \$500,000 in FY21 for CCA-106's (Insurance Division, INS) development, licensing, maintenance, and IVV of a cloud-based web hosting solution, including additional content management and document and workflow systems that will improve efficiencies and processes presently offered in the INS' legacy Hawaii Insurance Database System.

of 1.28% compared to the FY 19 appropriation.
