JANUARY 9, 2014

Honorable Chair Ige and Chair Luke, Vice Chair Kidani and Vice Chairs Nishimoto and Johanson, and Members of the Senate Committee on Ways and Means and House Committee on Finance:

I am Keali'i Lopez, and I am the Director of Commerce and Consumer Affairs ("DCCA"). I appreciate this opportunity to discuss the department's fiscal year 2015 budget with the committees.

Mission Statement

The Department's mission is to fairly regulate business, while ensuring consumer protection in commercial transactions in Hawaii.

DCCA's funding structure was established by the legislature in 1996 through the creation of the compliance resolution fund ("CRF"). With the exception of the general funds provided in Act 180, Session Laws of Hawaii ("SLH") 2013 to start up the Hawaii Post-Secondary Education Authorization Program, the department receives no general revenues. Instead, the CRF has become the primary funding source for DCCA's programs. The Department's financial strategy is based on ensuring that divisions have revenues to pay their expenses and that they contribute equitably to departmental overhead costs, while maintaining sufficient reserves to address unexpected contingencies. The legislature's foresight to develop this self-sufficiency model has benefitted our customers and the public we serve and the State over many years. Self-sufficiency notwithstanding, strong fiscal oversight continues to be important to the Department. The fees and revenue collected by the Department are provisioned for the purpose of delivering important commerce and consumer protection related services.

Toward that end, I appreciate the Committees' thorough review and consideration of the department's budget.

Impact of Current Economic and Fiscal Conditions

The DCCA, along with several other departments, has been active in implementing the Federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010 ("PPACA"). The Insurance Division ("INS") in particular has been heavily involved in rate review and approval of health insurers and health insurance policies in conformance with the federal law and the Hawaii Prepaid law. To that end, the Insurance Division's workload has increased dramatically, especially in light of the time constraints prescribed by federal law. The division went from reviewing 10-20 policies a year to over 200 variations of existing and new policies and staff is faced with reconciling Hawaii's existing laws with an ever-changing federal regulatory structure. In light of these new, long-term responsibilities, INS is requesting approval to add positions to meet the increased workload.

Similarly, the Division of Consumer Advocacy is seeking a ceiling increase to permit the division to retain additional consultants that can provide subject matter expertise in the growing number of alternative energy issues under consideration by the Public Utilities Commission. These resources will assist the division in responding timely, efficiently, and effectively to the energy-related issues facing the state.

Federal Funds

The Insurance Division has applied for and received various federal grants related to the PPACA. All of these federal funds received are non-recurring and are one-time project grants with expiration dates. No programs have lost or are at risk of losing federal funds prior to the grant expiration date.

Budget Request

The Department formulated a budget that provides the resources necessary for our programs to perform their functions and meet their goals and objectives. Requests for additional resources were prioritized to facilitate the accomplishment of our department's mission.

Where appropriate, trade-offs and transfers are proposed and ceiling increases limited to situations where: 1) resources are needed to carry out legislatively prescribed functions and actions, such as the continuation of the Post-Secondary Education Authorization Program (Act 180, SLH 2013), payment of claims against the Mortgage Loan Recovery Fund by consumers harmed by persons that violate Chapter 454F, HRS, and the new regulatory responsibilities resulting from the PPACA; 2) additional resources are needed to handle increased workloads stemming from new initiatives (e.g. the clean energy and broadband initiatives) and growth in licensing areas such as the Hawaii's captive insurance industry; and 3) funds are needed for

information technology projects such as the migration of our email system to a new platform, and for software upgrades that will facilitate standardization of information technology across the various state agencies.

The following are significant adjustments contained in our budget request:

1. Add 1.00 position and \$749,714 in special funds to support renewable energy initiatives for the Division of Consumer Advocacy ("DCA").

DCA represents the interests of utility, communication, and transportation service consumers before regulatory bodies such as the Public Utilities Commission ("PUC"), Federal Surface Transportation Board, and Federal Communications Commission. The program reviews requests for rate increases, capital improvement projects, integrated energy resource plans, issues regarding competition in the telecommunications and electric power industries, certificates to operate, and other applications filed with regulatory bodies by utility and transportation companies.

DCA requests additional funding to retain outside consultants. This will facilitate DCA's ability to conduct more extensive and thorough analyses to help investigate new and complex issues surrounding clean energy and broadband initiatives. Retaining the expertise of outside consultants allows DCA to present more credible evidence to the PUC in rate cases and investigative dockets, such as the Maui/Oahu undersea cable, Lanai Wind, decoupling, feed-in tariff, and on-bill financing. DCA is also seeking to fund another position for a third attorney to assist with various legal issues related to existing and anticipated proceedings. The additional attorney is necessary for DCA to effectively advocate for consumers in the upcoming rate cases that are anticipated from the electric utilities, Hawaii Gas, private water, private sewer, and Young Brothers. Furthermore, DCA's role in the State's push toward liquid natural gas involves complex legal issues, including utility regulation, environmental regulation compliance, potential antitrust violations, federal and state jurisdiction, and Jones Act.

2. Add 2.00 positions and \$95,045 in general funds and \$128,832 in special funds to support the Post-Secondary Educational Act of 1965 pursuant to Act 180, SLH 2013.

The Hawaii Post-Secondary Education Authorization Program ("HPEAP") requests an appropriation to continue and establish the program as a stand-alone. Because the program will not be self-sustaining based on projected revenues, this request is for general revenues of \$95,045 in FY15 to cover Personal Service costs for the program. The program seeks a special fund ceiling of \$128,832 in FY15 for Other Current Expenses and equipment expenses. These requests are necessary for continuation of the program.

HPEAP is staffed by a Program Administrator and the program requests authorization for a Program Specialist position that can assist with compliance. Although the program is in its infancy, it is critical that HPEAP have the capacity to appropriately handle the application and authorization process as well as complaints investigation and enforcement. The primary

purpose of the U.S. Department of Education regulation is to require that the states provide meaningful consumer protection relating to the practices of post-secondary schools, and it is essential that the program have the ability to effectively check for compliance with the HPEAP law and respond timely to consumer complaints.

3. Add \$2,000,000 in trust funds to allow the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations to implement the capital improvement grant pursuant to Chapter 42F, HRS, for the Hawaii Public Television Foundation.

The Cable Television Division ("CATV") establishes policies and standards for cable communication services. It reviews applications submitted by cable television companies and conducts inspections, tests, and compliance reviews as applicable. It develops and coordinates with other State agencies the implementation of the State's Institutional Network ("INET"). It monitors contractual requirements relating to public, educational, and governmental ("PEG") access on the cable television companies' cable systems. It receives and investigates complaints and answers inquiries or provides information relating to cable communications.

CATV is requesting a ceiling increase of \$2,000,000 to allow for an inter-departmental transfer to the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations ("DLIR") for Capital Improvement Program ("CIP") Grant to Hawaii Public Television Foundation.

Act 134, SLH 2013, provided a \$2,000,000 CIP appropriation for a Hawaii Public Television Foundation Grant-In-Aid project (plans, design and construction of a new building for PBS Hawaii). The expending agency is DLIR, with the funding to be provided by DCCA. This request will provide CATV with the appropriation for the transfer of funds to DLIR.

4. Add 6.00 positions and \$481,124 in special funds to support the new responsibilities related to the PPACA for the Insurance Division.

INS regulates, examines, and licenses insurance entities doing business in the State, regulate, examines and monitors the financial condition of domestic insurers; examines and licenses sales producers and brokers; reviews policy rates & forms filings; receives and investigates complaints; administers appeals pursuant to the patients' bill of rights & responsibility act; regulates captive insurers and develop Hawaii as a captive insurance domicile; and prosecutes automobile insurance claims fraud.

INS requests the addition of six positions to the Health Branch. Through the PPACA grants, additional positions were created to assist INS to address very complex issues. These federal funds will conclude in 2014 and INS seeks to add six of these established positions to its operating budget (special fund) in order to provide the manpower needed to meet the new regulatory responsibilities resulting from the PPACA. It is essential that INS maintains these experienced staff to address the challenges posed by the rapid growth in the health regulatory environment.

Delay in creating these additional positions will result in longer processing times for rate evaluations and approvals, licensing, examinations, and other regulatory activities that are essential in order for INS to continue its timely servicing, regulation and development of the health insurance industry. Failure to keep up with the needs of the industry in a timely manner will also undermine Hawaii's reputation as one of the leading states for healthcare.
