Honorable Chair Tokuda and Chair Luke, Vice Chair Dela Cruz and Vice Chair Nishimoto, and Members of the Senate Committee on Ways and Means and the House Committee on Finance.

I am Catherine Awakuni Colón, and I am the Director of the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs ("DCCA" or "Department"). I appreciate this opportunity to discuss the Department's fiscal year ("FY") 2017 budget with the committees.

### Overview

The Department's mission is to promote a strong and healthy business environment by upholding fairness and public confidence in the marketplace, and by increasing knowledge and opportunity for our businesses and citizens.

DCCA's funding structure was established by the Legislature in 1996 through the creation of the compliance resolution fund ("CRF"). The CRF is the primary funding source for DCCA's programs. The Department's financial strategy is based on ensuring that divisions have revenues to pay their expenses and that they contribute equitably to departmental overhead costs, while maintaining sufficient reserves to address unexpected contingencies. The Legislature's foresight to develop this self-sufficiency model has benefitted our customers and the public we serve and the State over many years. Self-sufficiency notwithstanding, strong fiscal oversight continues to be important to the Department. Consistent with applicable law, the fees and revenue collected by the Department are provisioned for the purpose of delivering important commerce and consumer protection related services.

Toward that end, I appreciate the committees' thorough review and consideration of the Department's budget.

### **Impact of Current Economic and Fiscal Conditions**

The Department operates in a quickly evolving consumer and business environment. Major developments in a number of regulated industries – including significant proposed mergers in Hawaii's energy and communications services industries, and fundamental changes in the State's implementation of the Affordable Care Act – demanded both the attention and the dedicated resources of several of the Department's divisions throughout this year. These significant changes require DCCA to remain focused on those priorities and initiatives that will allow the Department to operate most effectively and responsively to the needs of Hawaii's consumers and regulated businesses. Accordingly, the Department's supplemental budget for FY17 is selective and is designed to focus DCCA's efforts on those items that are identified priorities and that will help better position the Department to respond to consumer and commercial needs as the environment continues to change.

Among the significant developments faced by the Department this year are major changes in Hawaii's energy industry, both proposed and effective. Much of the Department's work over the past FY has been to ensure that the State's current and future energy needs are met in a resilient, cost-effective, and environmentally responsible manner. As the representative of Hawaii's utility ratepayers, the Division of Consumer Advocacy ("DCA") [CCA-103] has been extensively involved in ensuring that the State's electric utilities are providing reliable service at reasonable rates, in analyzing that they are meeting the State's Renewable Portfolio Standards ("RPS") and Energy Efficiency Portfolio Standards ("EEPS") goals, that steps are taken to ensure utilities' compliance with new EPA regulations, and that community concerns over energy-related projects are being adequately addressed. The proposed merger between NextEra Energy ("NextEra") and Hawaiian Electric Industries ("HEI") has also proven to be a significant regulatory development over the last year that continues to utilize much of the time and resources for both DCA and the Public Utilities Commission ("PUC") [CCA-901].

As the PUC has presided this year over the proposed NextEra-HEI merger and various other matters, the transfer of the PUC from the Department of Budget and Finance to the DCCA as an attached agency became final and effective on July 1, 2015. The PUC continues to also build its own internal capacity by increasing staff and expanding its facilities through a legislatively approved office renovation project and organizational restructuring. These steps are part of the PUC's long-term efforts to becoming the kind of regulatory agency that Hawaii and its dynamic energy industry needs. DCCA continues to support the PUC in its transition.

Similar to DCA and the PUC in the energy industry, the Cable Television Division of DCCA ("CATV") [CCA-102] also dedicated much of its time in the last year-and-a-half reviewing a pair of major proposed mergers, both involving the proposed acquisition of Oceanic Time Warner

Cable. The first proposed merger with Comcast was ultimately unsuccessful, while the second proposed merger with Charter Communications was conditionally approved by CATV in December of 2015, and resulted in a number of customer benefits for the local cable television service market. In both proposed mergers, CATV visited each of the major islands to hold public hearings and to gather input that would inform its decision making.

FY15 also saw the closing of Heald College, which created a significant influx of requests for guidance and materials from the recently created Hawaii Post-Secondary Education Authorization Program ("HPEAP") [CCA-107] within DCCA. In response to a substantial increase in workload for the program almost overnight, HPEAP was able to add an additional staff member in FY15 to assist with the program's operations. This program also continues to seek adjustments to its funding and operations as its role and the post-secondary environment changes.

Hawaii's transition from a state-based to a federal exchange under the Federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act ("PPACA") has significantly increased the work of the DCCA Insurance Division ("INS") [CCA-106]. The volume of filings at INS remains at about a nine-fold increase as compared to pre-PPACA. In addition, INS continues to contribute to the evolution of Hawaii's healthcare exchange by providing keen oversight of insurance-focused matters for the State, while the appropriate state and federal agencies continue to transition the organizational aspects of the winding down of the Hawaii Health Connector.

In addition, DCCA's multiple other divisions saw an active year working to ensure that Hawaii's consumer are protected and that business regulation in the State is appropriately carried out in a prudent fashion. Implementation of new DCCA programs established by the Legislature in the last several years, such as establishment of new professional licensing programs and related enforcement of new consumer protection laws, continue to be a top departmental priority. At the same time, the Department continues to view the upgrading of its information systems and related infrastructure as an essential part of providing effective regulation across many diverse industries, such as those in the areas of banking, mortgages, and other financial institutions, and those businesses making up the nearly 50 professional licensing boards, commissions, and programs within DCCA's purview. Finally, the Department recognizes the positive impact of proactive consumer and business education activities, and, as such, DCCA staff have worked hard this year to continue outreach efforts that include the recently revised Hawaii Fraud Guide for consumers and continued coordination of the Hawaii LifeSmarts Program both under the Business Registration and Securities Regulation Division [CCA-111].

### **Federal Funds**

The Department has no programs that have lost or are at risk of losing federal funds.

**Budget Request** 

The Department formulated a budget that provides the resources necessary for our programs to perform their functions and meet their goals and objectives. In designing this supplemental budget, the Department continued to focus on using its funding and resources as efficiently and judiciously as possible, which is consistent with the prudent fiscal approach stressed for all executive agencies. As such, the Department's requests for FY17 supplemental funds are limited to items that will allow the Department to successfully implement those priorities for which it has recently been given primary responsibility to carry out or in which the Department has come to otherwise play a significant role.

Where appropriate, trade-offs and transfers are proposed and ceiling increases are limited to situations including, but not limited to: 1) resources are needed to carry out legislatively prescribed functions or actions, such as the funding of required administrative assessments for the PUC pursuant to Section 36-30, Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS"); 2) funds are needed for information technology projects, like the replacement of the outdated licensee monitoring systems for the Division of Financial Institutions; and 3) resources are needed for new programs or initiatives, such as the creation of the behavior analyst licensing program effective January 1, 2016, pursuant to Act 199, Session Laws of Hawaii (SLH) 2015. The Department's requested budgetary adjustments are reflective of DCCA's expanded responsibilities and activity over the last several years in areas such as mortgage industry regulation, health care insurance reform, electric-energy utilities regulation, and the expanding communications services industry across the State. In order to keep pace with technological advancements and ensure that it is equipped with the right tools to adequately protect Hawaii's consumers, the Department also continues to place a high priority on the upgrade of the Department's information systems across multiple divisions.

Selected non-general fund adjustments are discussed in greater detail below:

1. Add \$500,000 in special funds to replace the Division of Financial Institution's ("DFI") outdated Financial Institutions Management Systems ("FIMS") information-database system for monitoring various licensees. [CCA-104]

DFI ensures the safety and soundness of state chartered and state-licensed financial institutions, and ensures regulatory compliance by state-licensed financial institutions, escrow depositories, money transmitters, mortgage servicers, mortgage loan originators and mortgage loan originator companies, by fairly administering applicable statutes and rules, in order to protect the rights and funds of depositors, borrowers, consumers, and other members of the public.

This request would increase DCCA's appropriation ceiling by \$500,000 in Other Current Expenditures for application replacement (7721-data equipment) that will allow DFI to replace its outdated FIMS application. The current FIMS data system was built more than 10 years ago, holds information about banks only, is based on an obsolete web-based platform that is no longer supported, and is incapable of interfacing with the national multi-state application, which is the primary means of obtaining and managing information on all types of licensees with the exception of banks. The FIMS replacement application will enable DFI to efficiently

process all aspects of the licensee interaction, from application processing and payment, through examinations and any required response by the licensee, to investigation initiation and final resolution, allowing for data analysis by industry and information storage in a secure environment.

The scope of this project will need to include a system gap analysis to determine the final implementation costs, recurring costs, and suitability of various solutions. DFI has already started preparing their application needs in anticipation of the system gap analysis. Because we are already in the process of implementing solutions utilizing a similar database platform, we anticipate the initial implementation costs, including hardware, may be negligible as compared to other solutions. Currently, we plan to run this project in two phases over a two-year period, with the gap analysis included in the first phase, along with the associated work to determine the details that need to be included in the statement of work, for the implementation phase of this project. Because of this, an estimate for the total implementation costs will not be available until the first phase is completed.

2. Add \$304,889 in special funds to allow the PUC to cover its portion of annual administrative assessments required by HRS § 36-30. [CCA-901]

The PUC ensures that regulated companies efficiently and safely provide their customers with adequate and reliable services at just and reasonable rates, while providing regulated companies with a fair opportunity to earn a reasonable rate of return.

The PUC's pro rata share of costs incurred by DCCA to fulfill DCCA's oversight and administrative support functions were calculated to be \$604,889 for FY17. However, Act 119, SLH 2015, approved only \$300,000 to meet this assessment for FY17 leaving the PUC Special Fund (PUC SF) ceiling \$304,889 short. HRS § 36-30 provides that the PUC SF "shall be responsible for its pro rata share of administrative expenses incurred by the department." Furthermore, HRS § 269-33 provides that the PUC SF shall be used "for costs incurred by the department of commerce and consumer affairs to fulfill the department's limited oversight and administrative support functions." Therefore, we request a PUC SF ceiling increase of \$304,889 in order to fully cover DCCA's administrative expenses assessment for FY17 as required by HRS § 36-30 and HRS § 269-33. Denial of this request may negatively impact the effective administrative operations of both the PUC and DCCA and/or cause a statutory violation.

 Add \$40,000 in special funds for the Professional and Vocational Licensing Division ("PVL") to appropriately fund the creation of a new Behavior Analyst licensing program pursuant to Act 199, SLH 2015. [CCA-105]

PVL ensures that the individual is provided with professional, vocational, and personal services meeting acceptable standards of quality, equity and dependability by establishing and enforcing appropriate service standards; to regulate activities for the protection, welfare and safety of the participants, as well as the public.

PVL is requesting an adjustment related to the creation of a licensing program for Behavior Analysts pursuant to Act 199, SLH 2015, and to be effective January 1, 2016. Act 199, SLH 2015, authorized the appropriation of funds for FY16, in the amount of \$40,000 for office supplies, postage, and other current expenses. The monies appropriated for the new program are currently in the separate fund CCA-105, S363. PVL is requesting the appropriation be added to the CCA-105, S305 fund, as monies for S363 are already being funded by the S305 fund.

It is anticipated, however, that for each mediation conducted the REB will be billed a maximum of \$8,000 by procured private providers at a cost of \$375 per hour with an eight hour maximum, although some cases may mediate for longer at the mediator's discretion. The REB expects to begin having to pay out of this fund within the next few months as mediations are conducted. There has been much interest generated over the evaluative mediation program as a means of resolving the numerous condominium disputes that arise among owners.
