# THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS HOUSE COMMITTEE ON FINANCE SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET BRIEFING FOR FISCAL BIENNIUM 2017-2019 OFFICE OF THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR PROGAM ID LTG100

#### I. Overview

#### A. MISSION STATEMENT

Pursuant to Article V, Section 4 of the Hawaii State Constitution, the primary mission of the Lieutenant Governor is to act in place of the Governor in his absence. Accordingly, the Lieutenant Governor must keep abreast of the actions and issues regarding the Administration to ensure he can effectively carry out the necessary functions of the office during these absences.

Pursuant to Section 26-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, another core function of the Office of the Lieutenant Governor is to serve as Secretary of State for intergovernmental relations. In this role, the Lieutenant Governor is charged with directing and performing a multitude of activities for the general public, which are administrative and coordinative in nature. These activities include:

- (1) Processing name changes;
- (2) Authenticating documents for use in foreign countries;
- (3) Handling the sale and distribution of official state publications;
- (4) Compiling administrative rules;
- (5) Compiling legislative acts; and
- (6) Posting state open meeting agendas.

Section 26-1 also indicates that, "the governor shall identify and direct other duties as necessary to the lieutenant governor." In the last year, the Lieutenant Governor has continued work on the Resources of Enrichment, Athletics, Culture and Health (R.E.A.C.H.) Initiative to support and expand after-school programs in public middle/intermediate schools throughout

the state and the Farm-to-School initiative, now known as the Aina Pono Farm to School Initiative to increase local products in public school breakfast and lunches statewide. Other projects include work on the Sports Development Initiative, Aerospace States Commission, and other programs and projects as assigned.

#### B. Economic Impact

The Office generates revenues for the State through fees collected for Secretary of State functions, including processing name changes, issuing apostilles and certifications, and selling state publications. These fees are established by statute and have not been adjusted or evaluated in many years. Such fees are deposited into the general fund and are not returned to our office to help offset the costs of operations. Since the implementation of the legal presence law in May 2012, the number of name changes processed by the Office significantly increased. Those numbers have tapered off some, as more individuals have come to comply with the law and as state identification cards and drivers' licenses have needed to be renewed. However, the introduction of online payment and processing of some name change petitions also caused the number of petitions to increase and maintain higher levels than expected.

The availability of some online name change forms was implemented in March 2014, and has helped to streamline the process, decrease processing times, and will continue to be expanded to include all name change forms in the future. The implementation of the state's electronic signature program has also impacted the name change process by reducing processing time.

A. The Office does not receive or expend federal funds.

#### III. Non-General Funds

A. The Office does not receive or expend non-general funds.

#### IV. Budget Request

A. After consideration of current funding levels, the Office determined that no additional funds were necessary to continue ongoing programs and Office operations at the current levels. Therefore, no request for additional funds was made.
