Directs and appropriates funds for the Department of Budget and Finance to conduct an economic impact study regarding the impact of potential changes to coffee labeling laws on the local coffee industry. Appropriates moneys for the pesticide subsidy program. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	AEN/EET, CPN/WAM
HB 1644, HD1 (SSCR3274) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION. Bans the manufacture, sale, or distribution for sale or use of wraps and liners, plates, food boats, pizza boxes, and firefighting foams that contain perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances. Effective 7/1/2100. (HD1)	AEN, CPN/WAM
HB 1570, HD1, SD1 (SSCR3441) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE YOUTH VAPING EPIDEMIC. Bans the sale of flavored tobacco products and mislabeled e-liquid products. Establishes fines. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	HTH/EDU, CPN/WAM

<p><u>HB 1635, HD2, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR3464)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO HEALTH CARE. Establishes the Rural Health Task Force within the Department of Health to prepare and develop solutions and make recommendations on registered nurse recruitment and retention in rural areas of Maui, Molokai, and Lanai. Requires the Rural Health Task Force to submit a report of its findings, recommendations, and any proposed legislation to the Legislature prior to the Regular Session of 2023. Effective 7/1/2060. (SD1)</p>	<p>HTH, CPN/WAM</p>
<p><u>HB 1575, HD2, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR3463)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS. Expands the scope of practice for physician assistants. Requires a sampling of medical records that includes certain amounts of controlled substance prescriptions, rather than all medical records, to be reviewed when physician assistants prescribe controlled substances. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)</p>	<p>HTH, CPN/WAM</p>
<p><u>HB 1619, HD2, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR3323)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO PEER-TO-PEER CAR-SHARING INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS. Establishes peer-to-peer car-sharing insurance requirements. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)</p>	<p>TRS, CPN/WAM</p>
<p><u>HB 1681, HD2, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR3249)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANIES. Establishes requirements and permitting procedures for transportation network companies operating in the State. Makes permanent insurance requirements for transportation network companies and transportation network company drivers. Takes effect 1/1/2023. (SD1)</p>	<p>TRS, CPN/WAM</p>
<p><u>HB 1980, HD2, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR3368)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO TELEPHONIC SERVICES. Requires Medicaid, health insurers, mutual benefit societies, and health maintenance organizations to cover services provided through telehealth by way of an interactive telecommunications system. Defines "interactive telecommunications system" to match the 2022 Medicare physician fee schedule final rule. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)</p>	<p>HTH, CPN/WAM</p>
