SB 204, SD1 (SSCR124) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO AQUATIC RESOURCES. Authorizes the department of land and natural resources to use in-lieu fee mitigation to restore, create, enhance, preserve, or any combination thereof aquatic habitats or resources as compensatory mitigation. (SD1)	WTL, JDC
SB 570 (SSCR184) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION. Amends the definition of "historic property" under the Historic Preservation Law.	WTL, JDC

Amends section 311-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to remove the Governor from the Education Commission of the States and add the executive director of the Hawaii state public charter school commission. (SD1)</p>	<p>EDU/GVO, JDC</p>
<p><u>SB 166</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO CAMPAIGN FINANCE. Prohibits foreign nationals and foreign corporations from making independent expenditures. Requires every corporation that contributes or expends funds in a state election to file a statement of certification regarding its limited foreign influence. Requires noncandidate committees making only independent expenditures to obtain a statement of certification from each top contributor required to be listed in an advertisement.</p>	<p>JDC</p>
<p><u>SB 448</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. Repeals section 46-19.8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and Act 53, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017, which prohibited the counties from adopting codes and regulations that would require the installation or retrofitting of residential fire sprinklers in one- and two-family dwellings and other types of structures.</p>	<p>JDC</p>
<p><u>SB 449</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. Requires sellers of residential buildings or structures to provide approved smoke alarms in accordance with current state or county building or residential codes.</p>	<p>JDC</p>
