<p><u>HB 1423, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR718-22)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO VIOLATIONS OF CAMPAIGN FINANCE LAW. Increases the fine that may be assessed for campaign spending law violations against a noncandidate committee making only independent expenditures and that has received at least one contribution of more than \$10,000, or spent more than \$10,000 in an election period. Allows the campaign spending commission to order that the fine be up to three times the amount of the unlawful contribution or expenditure, and that the payment of the fine assessed against a noncandidate committee, or any portion thereof, be paid from the personal funds of an officer of the noncandidate committee. Effective 7/1/2112. (HD1)</p>	<p>JDC, WAM</p>
<p><u>HB 1426, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR684-22)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO ORDERS OF THE CAMPAIGN SPENDING COMMISSION. Provides that a person waives the right to a contested case hearing if the person fails to request a contested case hearing within twenty days of receipt of the campaign spending commission's preliminary determination. Allows the campaign spending commission to have an order confirmed as a civil judgment, enforceable and collectible as any other judgment issued in the circuit courts. Effective 7/1/2112. <p><u>HB 1695, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR714-22)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO FIREWORKS. Increases from \$2,000 to \$5,000 the maximum fine that may be assessed against certain fireworks-related violations. Effective 1/1/2050. (HD1)</p>	<p>JDC, WAM</p>
<p><u>HB 2275, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR717-22)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO FIREWORKS INFRACTIONS. Establishes an expeditious adjudication system for the processing of fireworks infractions. Appropriates funds. Effective 1/1/2050. (HD1)</p>	<p>JDC, WAM</p>
<p><u>HB 1541</u> <u>(HSCR798-22)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO CRIMINAL COMPLAINTS. Clarifies acceptable procedure for initiating criminal complaints.</p>	<p>JDC</p>
