Requires HTA to develop a tourism management plan that includes tourism marketing, best practice destination management, and regenerative tourism. 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| <p>SB 2070 (SSCR2390) Status & Testimony</p> | <p>RELATING TO SPECIAL PURPOSE REVENUE BONDS TO ASSIST THE HAWAIIAN LEGACY REFORESTATION INITIATIVE TO RESTORE HAWAII'S FORESTS AND NATURAL RESOURCES. Authorizes the Department of Budget and Finance to issue special purpose revenue bonds to assist Hawaii Legacy Reforestation Initiative LLC in their mission to proliferate a sustainable model of endemic reforestation, ecosystem revitalization, endangered species recovery, and carbon credit sequestering.</p> | <p>AEN, WAM</p> |
| <p>SB 2071, SD1 (SSCR2427) Status & Testimony</p> | <p>RELATING TO HEALTH. Requires all principals, guidance counselors, and teachers to perform self-review of seizure safety materials annually. Requires a seizure action plan for every diagnosed student and distribution of the plan to employees charged with supervising the student. Requires public schools, private schools, and public charter schools to have an employee trained to administer seizure disorder rescue medication. | <p>SB 2167, SD1 (SSCR2019) Status & Testimony</p> | <p>RELATING TO FILM INFRASTRUCTURE TAX CREDIT. Creates a nonrefundable twenty percent film infrastructure tax credit. Requires that the film infrastructure project must spend at least \$3,000,000 on buildings, facilities, or installations. Caps the credit at \$10,000,000 per year. | <p>SB 2185, SD1 (SSCR2406) Status & Testimony</p> | <p>RELATING TO FIREWORKS. Increases the fees for permits required for the purchase and use of fireworks. Requires the auditor of fireworks and articles pyrotechnic records for each county fire department to submit an annual report to the Legislature detailing inventory, recordkeeping, and sales of fireworks to license or permit holders. Requires revolving accounts to follow Corporation policies. | <p>SB 2461, SD1 (SSCR2035) Status & Testimony</p> | <p>MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE HAWAII HEALTHY AGING PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM. Appropriates funds for the Hawaii Healthy Aging Partnership program to further the program's role in improving the health and well-being of Hawaii's kupuna. Effective 12/31/2050. | <p>SB 2480, SD1 (SSCR2644) Status & Testimony</p> | <p>RELATING TO THE WAHIAWA IRRIGATION SYSTEM. Authorizes the issuance of bonds for the Department of Agriculture and Agribusiness Development Corporation to purchase the Wahiawa Irrigation System on the island of Oahu. Takes effect 7/1/2050. | <p>SB 2482 (SSCR2488) Status & Testimony</p> | <p>RELATING TO WELLNESS. Establishes a temporary Office of Wellness and Resilience within the Office of the Governor. | <p>SB 2618, SD1 (SSCR2668) Status & Testimony</p> | <p>RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL. Establishes and funds an environmental investigative hotline pilot project through the Department of the Attorney General, Investigations Division, that will implement and manage an investigative hotline for Molokai residents to report environmental concerns on Molokai and have one full time investigator on the island of Molokai to investigate environmental concerns. Appropriates funds to create more residencies and training opportunities in medically underserved areas for medical students at the University of Hawaii John A. Burns School of Medicine. Appropriates funds to the John A. Burns School of Medicine to create further medical residency and training opportunities through a partnership between the John A. | <p>SB 2664, SD1 (SSCR2621) Status & Testimony</p> | <p>RELATING TO THE PROTECTION OF TARO. Creates a classification of agricultural public lands entitled "taro lands". Establishes a fourth class--taro lands classification for public lands. Permits structures for lo'i taro fields in the agricultural district. Establishes growth and perpetuation of traditional Hawaiian crops as a goal of the State Planning Act. | <p><u>SB 2768, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2645)</u> <u>Status &</u> <u>Testimony</u></p> | <p>RELATING TO THE HAWAII YOUTH CONSERVATION CORPS. Authorizes the Governor to designate the Department Of Land and Natural Resources to administer or enter into an agreement for the administration of a green jobs youth corps to provide temporary work and training opportunities in the fields of natural resource management, agriculture, or other sustainability-related professions to young adults ages thirty-eight and younger. Requires the department to partner with an organization that has received accreditation from the Corps Center of Excellence Accreditation Program or has at least ten years of experience providing similar programming statewide in the State, or both. Defines the role of third-party reviewers for the Department of Land and Natural Resources. Provides financial assistance to the counties to hire qualified staff to conduct the reviews.
