LILIHA REVITALIZATION PROJECT MOVES FORWARD

On May 2nd, the office on Housing and Urban Development, UH School of Architecture, the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco, the WATG firm and Office of Representative Ching all sat down to discuss the student projects on Liliha.

After seeing the months of dialogue come to life through the creativity of the students, projects were then displayed on May 10th for the entire community. Thanks to Pastor Max Fowler, of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, the teams were able to introduce their projects to an audience of 50+ residents, business leaders and contributors who were able to attend the meeting. A brief Q&A ensued, with encouragement from Rep. Ching and project coordinators to fill out a brief comment card. These comment cards allowed for the community to remark on their thoughts on the project.

2012 LEGISLATIVE OVERVIEW - Some Measures Passing through the Legislature

HB2012 - State Budget Appropriations: \$250,000 for Obesity and Diabetes Prevention Program; Approximately \$20 million General Obligation Bonds for HHSC;

HB304 - Grant-In-Aid: \$69,000 awarded to Palama Settlement to continue their efforts within the community;

SB2939- St. Francis SPRB: Authorizes the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds of up to \$80,000,000, for St. Francis Healthcare System of Hawaii to finance the construction, improvement, and equipment of certain Hawaii Medical Center East facilities:

SB2778 - Early Childhood

Health: Creates a taskforce to support early childhood development, including the collection of obesity data, childhood obesity awareness, and promotion of best practices to improve healthy life choices;

HB1054 - Education: authorizes affiliates of the Friends of the Library of Hawaii and certain nonprofit organizations supporting state library branches to use state library facilities for concessions, vending machines and other activities and to maintain their own accounts for the net proceeds under specified conditions;

HB2319 - Economic Development: establishes and appropriates funds for a venture accelerator funding program to assist the State's technology businesses compete for investment capital as well as an oversight program.

SB2320 - Aging: allows the Executive Office on Aging to establish the Kupuna Care Program, which will provide affordable and quality home- and communitybased services. The program may be provided in every county as a function of the aging and disability resource centers.



REP. CHING & STAFF HONORED FOR CANDLELIGHT

The Office of Representative Corinne W.L. Ching was recognized on Friday, May 11, 2012 during the 2012 Historic Hawaii Foundation's Preservation Honor Awards Ceremony. Honored with the Preservation Commendation Award, the team was recognized alongside of the sites that participated in the candlelight tour including the Taipei Economic & Cultural Office, Consulate General of the Republic of Korea, Consu-

late General of Japan, Daughters of Hawaii, Philippine Consulate General, Community Church of Honolulu and the Academy of the Pacific. The Preservation Commendation award is "the highest recognition of preservation projects that perpetuate, rehabilitate, restore or interpret the state's architectural, archaeological and / or cultural heritage," according to the foundation.
