

# **LEGISLATIVE ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

I was happy to have these measures that I authored/co-authored or supported pass the Legislature. The bills focus on sustainability, historical preservation, traffic and vehicle safety, and education.

**HB 1011** Defines dangerous wheels and prohibits their use on vehicles, trailers, and semi-trailers.

HB 1749 Amends the goals of the Hawaii water plan to include the utilization of reclaimed water for uses other than drinking and for potable water needs in one hundred percent of state and county facilities.

**HB 1753** Requires registration, inspections, and number plates for mopeds.

HB 2030 Prohibits the discharge of treated or raw sewage into state waters, except when used to create clean energy.

**HR 50** Requesting the Department of Transportation to designate Honolulu International Airport as the Daniel K. Inouye International Airport.

HR 124 Requesting the Department of Transportation, Department of Accounting and General Services, and University of Hawaii to create a traffic mitigation plan for the Leeward and Central area of Oahu.

HR 126 Urging the Department of Transportation Services of the City and County of Honolulu to implement the traffic safety recommendations identified in the Kupuna Loop sub-area corridor study conducted by SSFM International and to repave all City roadways in the Kunia and Village Park area.

HR 130 & HCR 180 Requesting the Department of Education to further develop and implement a plan to address overcrowding in public schools in Kapolei, Ewa, Waipahu, Mililani, and Pearl City.

# **Cooling our Schools**

S.B. No. 3126 (Act 47), Relating to Public Schools, was signed into law by Governor Ige on May 5th, 2016. The measure allows an emergency appropriation of \$100 million to fund equipment and installation costs for air conditioning, heat abatement measures and energy efficiency measures at public schools across the state.
