I joined my colleagues from the House of Representatives to stand in support for the people of Ukraine. House Resolution 28 and House Concurrent Resolution 32, introduced by the vice chair of the House Culture, Arts and International Affairs Committee, Rep. Adrian Tam, not only rebukes Russia for its aggression against Ukraine, but also calls for the State of Hawai'i to suspend any business or contracts with the Russian Government or Belarussian Government, or contractors of either government. Mahalo to everyone who helped come together to put forth this resolution.



The State Capitol building is open! Pursuant to the Governor's current emergency order, photo ID and proof of 1) full vaccination (original, hard copy, or photo/digital copy of state-approved vaccination card) or 2) negative COVID-19 test taken within 72 hours will be required before entering the State Capitol. Masks are required while visiting the State Capitol. This policy is subject to change and may be adjusted based on evolving COVID-19 guidelines. All Senate and House committee hearings and floor sessions will be streamed live on YouTube. House and Senate standing committees will accept written, in-person, and remote testimony via Zoom.

Get active at the legislature

First Crossover:

Only about 25% of the bills introduced typically survive the First Crossover deadline. It may be a good idea to take a look at what remains — you may find that you were unaware of some of the ideas being considered. Ask for hearings for those bills you support, and offer testimony on scheduled bills that you care about.

To find all bills that have survived the First Crossover deadline (March 10th), click on the "Reports and Lists" button on the Legislature's website (capitol.hawaii.gov), and then scroll down to the "First Crossover" section. You have a choice of whether you want to see all House or Senate bills that are still alive (2021 and 2022 bills) or want to see only the bills that have seen action so far this session ("with Action Taken in 2022 Only").

It's worth scrolling through the lists to see what's alive. Why? Many bills have changed since they were first introduced — a bill that initially did not interest you may have been changed in a way that makes it worthy of your interest now.

Concurrent Resolutions:

The deadline for offering "Substantive Resolutions" is Friday, March 11th. This deadline applies to most concurrent resolutions, which are resolutions that are adopted by both chambers and express the will or intent of the entire legislature. These HCRs and SCRs are "offered" by their introducers and then referred to committees in the same manner as bills. After succeeding in all its committees in the originating chamber, a resolution comes to the floor for a vote to adopt. If successful, it crosses to the other chamber for consideration, again being referred to committees and ultimately to the floor of that chamber for adoption. If it fails to be adopted in either chamber, nothing happens. If adopted by both chambers, look to the last paragraph of the resolution itself — it will indicate where certified copies of the resolution will be sent.
