

be on Waiohuli
Street, in the Waiohuli
Subdivision of Kīhei.

The developers are

required to apply for a permit to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers because there will be cutting and filling required for the project, and a portion of the development overlaps on designated wetlands. The permit is required by Sec. 404 of the Clear Water Act.

HB1985 – Taxation Political contributions may no longer be deducted from taxable income.

HB2003 – Campaign Financing

Corporations that contribute more than \$1000 will need to file with the Campaign Finance Commission.
