Today, Friday, September 24, 2021, the count for new COVID cases on Oahu is 248 with nine (9) deaths. Tragically two of the nine deaths were a man and woman in their 20s.

Oahu is finally seeing some improvement this week, but our daily average rate is 5.4% for the past seven days. And with the Delta variant being so highly transmissible, we must remain vigilant. Please continue to exercise proper social distancing, avoid social gatherings, wear a mask, and wash your hands frequently.

ORDERING A FREE COVID-19 TEST KIT

Thousands of Oahu residents can begin ordering free COVID-19 test kits, while supplies last, thanks to a federal pilot program called the "Say Yes! COVID Test At-Home Testing Challenge." Eight rapid antigen tests will be sent out to 125,000 residents who live in eligible ZIP codes. Thankfully, District 42 (96707) is one of those eligible ZIP codes.

Participants are encouraged to use the tests twice a week for four weeks, regardless of symptoms.

The Premier Medical Group has used these rapid COVID tests and found the tests are more reliable with people who are showing COVID symptoms.

The tests are antigen and FDA approved under emergency use authorization. They are acceptable under the Safe Access Oahu program. However, at-home COVID tests cannot be used by City employees who received a vaccine exemption. Free, rapid, self-administered testing will give community members one more way to help reduce the spread of COVID-19. This program provides participating communities with another tool to protect themselves and their families.

The self-administered test kits will be available through Monday, October 18, or while supplies last. These tests cannot be used for workplace testing requirements or other programs. Results can be ready in about 10 minutes.

PROCESS TO REQUEST A REPLACEMENT VACCINATION CARD

Only for individuals vaccinated in Hawaii

Where did you get vaccinated?

Hospital, Pharmacy, DOD, VA or medical insurance directed location

Leeward Community College Point of Dispensing (POD)

Hawaii Department of Health (HI-DOH) POD
County on: Kauai, Maui or Big Island

At a mobile POD (e.g., those that have since closed Hawaii and are no longer located at the point they were vaccinated) AND you know who was running the mobile POD

If you don't know who was operating the POD where you received your vaccination

The Vaccine Administration Management System (VAMS) printout will be accepted if you registered for your vaccination using VAMS. Log into the system and print out the VAMS Certificate.

How do I request a replacement card?
