WHO CAN GET A COVID VACCINE?

Vaccines are currently available to Group "1b" which is **people 75**+ years old and certain essential workers. Due to limited supply, priority within the "1b" group is being given to people 75+ years old. Some vaccine hubs (Kaiser and Castle) will allow qualified essential workers to register and obtain appointments as vaccine supply permits — so check the links and see if you can get in the system.

WHERE CAN WAIMANALO AND KAILUA RESIDENTS GET VACCINATED?

KAISER Eligible Kaiser members who are registered on <u>kp.org</u> will receive an email with an e-ticket to make an appointment to get the shots. Kaiser's 24-hour hotline for vaccine information is 1-855-550-0951

ADVENTIST HEALTH CASTLE is open to all and free, unless you are a Kaiser member, in which case there is a \$20 fee. You can register for an appointment at Castle's website:

You will need to create a Vagaro account to use the website to make a vaccine appointment.
