REP. YAMANE'S BILLS BECOME LAW

Water and Land Committee Legislative Accomplishments

I am happy to share with our community some of the many accomplishments the House Committee of Water and Land was fortunate to achieve while I served as its Chair this year:

House Bill 2037: International Union for Conservation of Nature World Conservation Congress, a bill I introduced, appropriates \$4 Million for the State of Hawaii to host the IUCN World Conservation Congress meeting this September 1-10, 2016. By hosting this event, Hawaii is being recognized as a World leader through our local conservation efforts.

House Bill 2675: Rapid 'Ōhi'a Death, protects our State's precious 'Ōhi'a trees by investing \$300,000 toward research to combat rapid 'Ōhi'a death.

Senate Bill 2647: Wildlife Trafficking, a bill my office vigorously worked on, prohibits the sale, purchase, trade, possession with intent to sell, or barter of any product from various endangered animal and marine species, including Ivory, except for Hawaiian cultural use, and musical instruments, guns and knives which include 20% of Ivory.

House Bill 1749: Reclaimed Water Use, will improve our State's overall water reuse rate by utilizing reclaimed water for uses other than for drinking and potable water needs in all of our State and County buildings by 2045.

House Bill 2030: Wastewater Discharge Ban, a bill I introduced, will prohibit the discharge of raw sewage and treated wastewater from Wastewater Treatment Plants into our state waters and ocean within 10 years, except when these treatment plants use clean energy.

House Bill 2029: Water Infrastructure Loans, a bill I introduced, appropriates \$800,000 to make loans for private entities to purchase or install water infrastructure equipment to improve water distribution systems that serve our communities.

House Bill 2040: Water Security Advisory Group, a bill I introduced, increases the State's water security by creating an advisory group to finance \$750,000 in public-private partnerships for projects that will protect our precious water.

Senate Bill 2645: Water Audits, a bill my office vigorously worked on, requires the State to implement standardized water audits of County and public water systems.

Our House Committee on Water and Land worked diligently to preserve Hawaii's unique and scarce natural resources this year to malama our 'aina for future generations to enjoy Hawaii's special beauty.

BUDGET SOLUTIONS

Hawaii's 2015-2017 State Budget

The economy is still the number one concern for many of our residents. The Legislature also crafted a responsible budget (HB 1700) that addresses the state's long-term obligations while taking care of its immediate social services needs and capital improvement requirements. The budget is not just about expenses and revenues. Together with our long-term strategic financial plan, a thoughtful budget will also help fuel, direct and shape a healthy and sustainable economy.

This year's State Budget responds to the pressing needs of Hawaii's people, while carefully scrutinizing expenses by appropriating funds to ensure that significant priorities are met and improve our infrastructure

EDUCATING OUR KEIKI

Act 47- Air Conditioning Our Schools

Appropriates \$100 Million to the Department of Education to install air conditioning and energy efficient lighting for schools throughout the State for the purposes of heat abatement and energy efficiency. Providing this heat abatement in our schools will improve the health and learning environments for our students.


House Bill 2569- Establishing a Net-Zero Goal for Our Schools

Requires the Department of Education to establish a goal of becoming net-zero and energy efficient by 2035.

Senate Bill 2981- Recognizing American Sign Language under the DOE Language Requirement

Recognizes American Sign Language as a world language and allows public school students who pass courses in American Sign Language to receive credit toward world language requirements for graduation.

CARING FOR OUR 'AINA

House Bill 2646- Establishing a Red Hill Fuel Tank Advisory Committee

Protects public health by creating a permanent Fuel Tank Advisory Committee to study, monitor, and address fuel tank leak issues at the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility, Kuahua Peninsula, Pacific Missile Range Facility Barking Sands, Hickam Pol Annex, and Schofield Barracks Military Reservation.

House Bill 2034- Restoring Kaho'olawe

A bill I introduced, appropriates \$450,000 to the Kahoʻolawe Island Reserve Commission to support the restoration and management of Kahoʻolawe Island.

IMPROVING HEALTHCARE FOR HAWAII

Senate Bill 2886- Expanding Adolescent Mental Health Services

Lowers the age of consent to receive mental health treatment and counseling services, except prescription medication or out-of-home or residential treatment, from 18 years to 14 years of age.

Senate Bill 2560- Providing Mental Health Services to our Homeless

Addresses the mental health of homeless persons by funding \$500,000 and requiring treatment and care for homeless individuals with serious and persistent mental health challenges to enable them to reside in a permanent dwelling unit or homeless facility.

House Bill 2252- Supporting Caregivers at Hospitals

Requires hospitals to adopt and maintain written discharge policies consistent with federal regulations in which each patient can designate a caregiver, and each patient and the patient's designated caregiver can participate in the discharge planning and receive instruction prior to discharge related to the patient's after-care needs.

Senate Bill 2557- Protecting our Athletes from Concussions

Expands the Concussion Educational Program for high school students to include youth athletics. Appropriates \$450,000 to develop and implement the Concussion Monitoring and Educational Program for school athletics, develop and implement a concussion and awareness program for youth athletics, and administer concussion testing to high school student athletes.

Act 10- Monitoring Diabetes in Schools

Authorizes the self-administration of blood glucose monitoring by a student in a public school. Also allows DOE employees to volunteer to administer blood glucose monitoring or to assist a student with blood glucose monitoring.

STRENGTHENING OUR ECONOMY

Senate Bill 3110- Investing in Local Small Businesses

Diversifies Hawaii's economy, assists small businesses conducting innovative research toward commercialization, and promotes manufacturing by appropriating \$2 Million to provide grants and loans through the High Technology Development Corporation for federal small business innovation research awards.

Senate Bill 3109- Strengthening Local Manufacturing

Creates a vibrant, sustainable economy and provides for opportunities for growth in the manufacturing industry in Hawaii by appropriating \$1 Million to the manufacturing development program through which the High Technology Development Corporation will distribute grants to Hawaii manufacturers

SUPPORTING OUR MILITARY

House Bill 1700- Supporting Guard Training at the Pohakuloa Training Area

Finances \$800,000 for the design and construction of a warehouse to serve as a storage site for training logistics for the Hawaii National Guard.

House Bill 1700- Upgrading Kalaeloa Energy Infrastructure

Champions \$3 Million to complete and improve the electrical system for Hawaii National Guard operations in Kalaeloa to support our troops.

House Bill 1700- Improving Kalaeloa Airport Infrastructure

Appropriates \$638,000 to upgrade the infrastructure systems to support our Hawaii Air National Guard operations at Kalaeloa Airport.

FIXING OUR ROADS

House Bill 2049- Repairing Disputed Private Roads

A bill I introduced, resolves the issue of responsibility for the repair and maintenance of private roads, where the ownership is disputed by the City. This bill creates a temporary Roads Commission and appropriates \$2 Million to review and resolve disputed road ownership issues. The bill also expands the State and County's authorities to condemn private roads in order to repair and maintain these roads to protect our public's safety.

House Bill 2086- Replenishing the State Highway Fund

Appropriates \$37 Million into the State Highway Fund and requires the Governor to provide a plan to sustain the highway fund and address the maintenance of our highways.

House Bill 1753- Requiring Moped Safety

Improves public and roadway safety by regulating the use of mopeds, including requiring their registration, safety inspection, and requiring the use of a license plate.

Over \$88 Million in Projects Supporting Our Community

I am proud to announce that our community will receive over \$88 Million in repair and maintenance projects for our schools, roadways, and community infrastructure.

Collectively our Mililani, Waipio, and Waikele schools will receive a combined total of \$29.8 Million in school improvement projects through our State Budget. These projects are vital to support our children's education, our families' safety and maintaining the special beauty of our Central Oahu communities.
