## **Tourism Committees Visit Ko Olina Resorts**

With tourism as the focal point of Hawaii's economy, the addition of a Disney and Hawaiian themed resort expands the range of what we have to offer as a worldclass vacation destination. Resort officials are hoping to both attract visitors by combining the Disney magic with the culture and scenery of Hawaii.



Last month, Tourism Committee Chairs of both the Senate and the House toured two Ko Olina resort properties, the **Marriott's Ko Olina Beach Club** and the brand new **Disney Aulani Resort**. Hosted by the ARDA-Hawaii, legislators went on site visits to both properties and were given the opportunity to have their questions and concerns answered by resort officials afterwards.

These resorts will help our tourism industry which has seen a steady recovery over the past two years, with total visitor spending consecutively increasing for the past 18 months. Recent projections have shown that visitors have spent \$1.1 billion in October, a 15.6% rise from last October. Current projections show that visitor spending this year could break the previous record from 2007, the year prior to the economic downturn. While recent years have been difficult, the tourism numbers are showing that the economy is on the path towards recovery and with it—Hawaii as well.
