Joint Legislative Investigating Committee

The 2010 Legislative Session passed Senate Concurrent Resolution No.18, establishing a joint legislative investigating committee to oversee the investigation of the Department of Budget and Finance's handling of the state's investment in student loan auction rate securities (SLARS).

The committee members are: Senators Donna Mercado Kim, Shan Tsutsui, Sam Slom and Representatives Marcus Oshiro, James Tokioka, and Gene Ward. The committee met on October 11, 2010.

This committee shall assist the independent attorney in charge of the investigation by holding meetings and hearings as requested. A report of findings will be submitted to the Legislature 20 days prior to Session 2011.

Kalihi-Palama Health Center Joins Fight Against Chronic Kidney Disease

Chronic kidney disease is the ninth leading cause of death in Hawaii. The Kalihi-Palama Health Center (KPHC) announced that it will team up with the National Kidney Foundation of Hawaii to help fight this disease that affects more than 27 million Americans each year and one out of every seven people in Hawaii.

Kalihi-Palama Health Center received \$150,000 in federal funding in 2010 and will receive an additional \$250,000 for 2011 to develop and improve health care programs specifically targeting high-risk populations. KPHC is the second largest community health center in Hawaii. Last year, it served 20,000 people in 95,000 visits.

Update on KPT Redevelopment

The Hawaii Public Housing Authority held their board of directors meeting on October 21, 2010. Reno & Cavanaugh was recently selected as legal counsel for the KPT Redevelopment project. What does this mean? Once the contract is signed, HPHA's legal counsel must review several legal documents before the project can proceed.
