Two Constitutional Amendments to be on Ballot

There will be two proposed constitutional amendments on the ballot in the November General Election. One concerns changing our elected school board to an appointed one. The other proposal deals with state surpluses.

The first question will be: "Shall the Board of Education be changed to a board appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate, as provided by law?"

The second question will be: "Shall the legislature be provided with the choice, when the state general fund balance at the close of each of two successive fiscal years exceeds five per cent of the general fund revenues for each of the two fiscal years, to provide a tax refund or tax credit to the taxpayers of the State, or to make a deposit into one or more funds, as provided by law, which shall serve as temporary supplemental sources of funding for the State in times of an emergency, economic downturn, or unforeseen reduction in revenue?"

Congratulations to **Red Hill Elementary School** for meeting "adequate yearly progress" goals under the No Child Left Behind Act. For a school to attain the federal NCLB goals this year on the Hawaii State Assessment, 58 percent of students had to demonstrate proficiency in reading and 46 percent had to be proficient in math. With Red Hill recently added, there are a total of 145 schools or 51 percent of public schools meeting this goal.

Free Flu Vaccine for Kids

The Hawaii State Department of Health, in collaboration with the Department of Education, Hawaii Association of Independent Schools, Hawaii Catholic Charities, and community partners, will again offer free flu vaccines for kindergarten through middle school students this fall.

The clinics offer a convenient way for children to get vaccinated instead of parents having to take time off from work to take their child to their health care provider. This year, the **Stop Flu at School** program will begin dispensing vaccinations statewide on October 12th. Update on Kuhio Park Terrace

Keeping you abreast of ongoing progress with plans to redevelop Kuhio Park Terrace....Michaels Development Company was awarded the bid to redevelop KPT. However, as of the date of this publication, the Hawaii Public Housing Authority (HPHA) still has not selected legal counsel for the development. There are three national legal counsel firms familiar with mixed-income dealings that are being considered and HPHA hopes that a selection will be made soon. Because Congress has set the alternative tax credit deadline as January 1, 2011, the developers are hoping to accelerate this project by 2-3 months and would like to start construction before December 31, 2010.
