Senator Kim Named to Two Special Committees

The 2010 Legislature passed SCR18 which establishes a joint legislative **investigating committee to oversee the Department of Budget and Finance's handling of the State's investment in student loan auction rate securities**. Senator Kim was recently named to this committee along with Senators Tsutsui and Slom. With appointees from the House, the committee will help determine whether the State acted legally and responsibly in investing \$1,100,000,000 in student loan auction rate securities and will report back to the 2011 Legislature.

SCR108 established a **Charter School Task Force**. Its mission is to create a consistent funding formula and process to determine equitable funding for charter schools. Members of this committee include Rep. Marcus Oshiro-House Finance Chair; Senator Donna Mercado Kim-Senate Ways & Means Chair; James Brese-DOE; Bob Roberts-Charter School Administrative Office; Georgina Kawamura-Dept. of Budget & Finance; Carl Takamura-Charter School Review Panel; Megan McCorriston-Ho'okako'o Corp. and Alapaki Nahale-a-Hawaii Charter School Network. *Congratulations Tyson!*
