Hawaii State law requires the establishment of bipartisan Reapportionment Commission to redraw the boundaries on the political districts. This ninemember commission is comprised of four selections each from both the minority and majority parties—with the commission chair elected by the commission members.

Early last month, the Commission published their proposed draft reapportionment plans for public comment and review. You can review these proposals and other redistricting information online at **http://hawaii.gov/elections/ reapportionment.**

Aloha Friends and Neighbors,

As you may remember, last year the federal government conducted a census across the nation and in Hawaii. The census is performed once every ten years with the purpose of gathering current and accurate information on the changing demographics that make up Hawaii and the shifting populations across the state. Now that the data has been collected, the State's legislators and the districts that they represent must also be updated. This is to ensure that all legislators represent the same amount of people and their constituents have an equal voice in state matters.

> The final draft of the reapportionment plan is due by September 26, 2011. Until the deadline, the Reapportionment Commission is seeking public input and will be holding public hearings to gain feedback from the communities. You can find the upcoming schedule of hearings below.

Walk Wise Hawaii Steps to Safety

• Cross the street only at the corner or at a crosswalk. While crossing, keep to the right of the crosswalk.

• When crossing at a lighted intersection be sure to use the pedestrian signal button and wait for the walk light indicator.

- Be sure to look left-right-left before crossing and continue to look while crossing. Always walk across the street, never run.
- Walk on the sidewalk if there is one; if there is no sidewalk, walk on the left side of the roadway facing traffic.
- Wear bright or light colored clothing when out walking or jogging. Wear retroreflective materials at night.
- Watch for cars backing out of driveways; drivers don't always see you.

• Stand on the side of the road while waiting for the bus. Always stand at least 10 feet away from where the bus will stop.
