STATE APPROVED FOR \$300 UI FEDERAL PLUS UP PROGRAM

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has approved the state's application to participate in the unemployment insurance plus up program called the Lost Wages Assistance Program (LWAP).



The program, under FEMA, was created by the president via a memorandum earlier this month in

response to the July expiration of the unemployment \$600 weekly benefit.

Hawaii will offer an additional unemployment compensation benefit of \$300 per week to eligible unemployment recipients. To qualify for this benefit, recipients must be eligible for at least \$100 in weekly benefits and must certify that they are unemployed or partially unemployed due to the disruptions caused by COVID-19. Payments would be retroactive to August 1, 2020.

Additional information on the program and how to apply will be announced shortly.

SURGE TESTING CONTINUES THIS WEEK

Last week Wednesday was the first day of "surge testing" on Oahu where federal, state and county partners hope to test 5,000 people each day over two weeks.

This testing is free of charge and pain free. However, you must register prior to arriving at the testing site. You do not need a doctor's referral nor do you need to be a resident of the community where the testing site is located. Results are expected to be available 3-5 days following a test.

HECO MORATORIUM ON DISCONNECTIONS EXTENDED TO DECEMBER 31

Hawaiian Electric has extended the moratorium on disconnections of electric utilities to December 31, 2020. The Public Utilities Commission (PUC) ordered that all regulated utilities extend their moratoriums, and reminded customers to pay "their bills to the extent possible during this time, noting that customers will still ultimately be responsible for paying Utility service billings accrued during this suspension."

<u>"STAY AT HOME, WORK FROM</u> <u>HOME" ORDER CONTINUES</u> <u>THROUGH SEPT. 9</u>

Oahu is nearly halfway through the two-week stay-at-home order that was implemented due to the recent surge in

COVID-19 cases. This order is similar to an earlier one issued by Gov. Ige in March, which allowed only essential services to remain open, encouraging telework and limiting restaurants to take-out only.

At a news conference, Honolulu Police Chief Susan Ballard informed the public to contact a newly established COVID-19 enforcement hotline at (808) 723-3900 or email <u>hpdcovidenforce@honolulu.gov</u> to report violators. "We've tried to warn people, educate people," she said. "At I this point, there are probably going to be very few warnings. It's going to be either citations or arrests."

SATELLITE CITY HALLS & DRIVER LICENSING CENTERS CLOSE TO IN-PERSON SERVICES



The city's Department of Customer Ser-

vices will be suspending for two weeks all face-to-face visits to its offices on Oahu, beginning Thursday, Aug. 27.

The suspension includes in-person transactions at driver licensing centers and satellite city halls.

The temporary closure complies with Mayor Kirk Caldwell's emergency stay-at-home, work-at-home orders that will remain in effect through Wednesday, Sept. 9 to help curb the spread of the coronavirus.

Only appointments during the two-week closure period will be canceled. Efforts will be made to reschedule those affected as a priority. Appointments will be honored after the orders are lifted as scheduled.

Department staff will continue to process online and mail-in applications, payments as well as perform other administrative functions.
