#### SENATE TO TAKE ACTION ON JUDICIAL APPOINTMENT

The Senate in their second special session of 2022 will convene on August 22-23 to take action on the appointment of Annalisa Bernard to

serve as a District Court Judge for the Second Circuit (Maui). Bernard has been employed at Wong Leong Cuccia in Maui since 2021.

Prior to that she worked as a Maui Deputy Prosecuting Attorney from 2015 to 2021 and a Deputy Public Defender from 2005 to 2015. She served as a law clerk for Judge Michael Town (ret.) and Judge Derrick Chan (ret.) from 2004 to 2005. The Chief Justice made his appointment from the nomination list presented to him by the Judicial Selection Commission on July 6, 2022. Bernard's appointment is subject to Senate confirmation.

# HAWAII PROMISE SCHOLARSHIP

The Hawaii Promise Scholarship is a "last dollar" scholarship that provides free instate tuition for qualified University of Hawai'i Community College students who need financial help to pay for college. For eligible students, the Hawaii Promise scholarship provides money from UH and the State of Hawai'i to cover direct education costs—including tuition, fees and an allowance for books and suppliesthat are not met by other forms of financial aid.

In SY 2020-21, more than 1,800 students from seven UH Community Colleges statewide benefitted from almost \$3 million in Hawai'i Promise scholarships. The average award was \$1,629.

# You may be eligible for a debt-free degree with the Hawaii Promise Scholarship

#### Eligibility Requirements:

- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
- 1. Be a State of Hawai'i resident or qualify for exempt status that pays in-state tuition.
- 2. Be enrolled in at least 6 credits per semester at a UH Community College
- 3. Be degree-seeking in a financial aid eligible program.
- 4. Must accept all federal and state grants, scholarships, and any other funding sources that do not require repayment
- 5. Maintain satisfactory academic progress
- 6. Not have already achieved an undergraduate degree

Awards are contingent upon funding and amounts are based upon enrollment level, financial need, and other financial resources
