

# Aloha Friends and Neighbors,

The 2015 session of the Legislature convened on January 21. While the mood of legislators on opening day was optimistic and hopeful, it was also tempered by the realities of our fiscal condition. Yes, the economy continues to show strength, with tourism arrivals and spending up, construction proving resilient, and the military maintaining its spending.

But the Legislature must find ways to deal with the collective bargaining pay increases negotiated by the previous administration. We have major financial obligations for long-term pension and health care costs for current and future retirees. Our public buildings and infrastructure need major investment that cannot be defrayed. These are some of the reasons the Legislature is taking a very cautious approach to spending and the biennium budget.

For my part, I am continuing my push for greater transparency and accountability in government. My legislative proposals call for the creation of an inspector general to investigate reports of fraud, corruption, and mismanagement in government; the inclusion of long-term repair and maintenance cost projections for public construction in our six-year financial plan; using hotel room tax revenues for beach replenishment projects; and expanded ethics training for public officials, candidates for office, and lobbyists, among others. I've also called for greater state and county oversight on vacation rentals, which continue to be a source of controversy—and lost tax revenues—throughout the islands. While my proposal is one of several, I believe a concerted, intergovernmental effort would produce the best means of resolving this long-standing problem once and for all.

On a matter of immediate concern to District 14 residents, an intergovernmental task force formed to examine leaking underground fuel storage tanks on Red Hill is recommending that the Navy double-line 18 tanks to prevent future leaks, within the next 10 years. I had introduced the resolution calling for the formation of the task force, immediately after the Navy announced last January that a major fuel leak had occurred at Red Hill. I expect the Legislature can contribute to a settlement that ensures the safety of our water supply without affecting military readiness.

I will keep you apprised of further developments regarding the Red Hill situation, as well as our work at the Legislature.
