Education Commission of the States

The Education Commission of the States (ECS) was established in 1965 by the states to help governors, legislators, state education officials and other policymakers identify, develop and implement policies to improve student learning at all levels.

ECS helps develop effective policy and practices for public education by providing data, research, analysis and leadership; and by facilitating collaboration, the exchange of ideas among the states and long-range strategic thinking.

I have been involved with ECS since July 2001 when I was appointed a Hawaii State Commissioner of ECS. In August, ECS held its annual National Forum on Education Policy in Portland, Oregon. As the Chair of the National Forum Planning Committee, we worked with ECS staff and committee to review and approve the overall design and desired outcomes of the ECS annual meeting. The National Forum is the only major national education conference that draws policy leaders from every role within the state governance structure and focuses on state education policy issues.

DISTRICT NEWS

Last December, the City paved several side streets (Ala Amoamo), several intersecting streets to the main road (Ala Mahamoe) and the street fronting the Moanalua Elementary and Middle schools (Mahiole).

At that time a worker for the contractor indicated that the main street (Ala Mahamoe) was also scheduled to be repaved. That was almost 9 months ago and nothing has been done to the main road since.

The City and County of Honolulu has confirmed that Ala Mahamoe Street was put under a different contract and the City is now waiting for the money to be put in place. Everything is ready to go and the work could begin as early as a few weeks, depending on the new contractor's schedule and weather.
