HB1901	RELATING TO TWO-	-STROKE ENGINES.	CPC.

Bans the sale of two-stroke engines and new machines and vehicles operated by a two-stroke engine, effective January 1, 2024. Establishes the electric engine loan program and revolving

fund. Makes an appropriation.

HB1902 RELATING TO WETLAND PRESERVATION. HSG/WAL, CPC

Amends provisions that exempt a proposed housing project of the Hawaii housing finance and development corporation from statutes, ordinances, charter provisions to include a requirement that the proposed project does not impact wetlands or natural stormwater infrastructure. Requires an environmental assessment for actions under the environmental impact statements law that propose any development that would impact

wetlands or natural stormwater infrastructure.

RELATING TO DATA ABOUT SNORKELS AND MASKS. JHA, CPC HB1903

Requires the first responder to record in the incident report for each water rescue event the type of snorkel and mask, if any, that were worn by the person who was rescued or recovered.

Exempts sales of cannabis and manufactured cannabis products for medical use from the general excise tax. Clarifies that qualifying out-of-state patients have the same rights and privileges under the medical cannabis law. Allows qualifying out-of-state patients to cultivate medical cannabis. <u>HB1908</u>	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Allows bidders to clarify or correct immaterial or technical information required as part of a bid submission for up to twenty-four hours after the bid submission deadline. Requires that bids for construction be opened no sooner than twenty-four hours after the deadline for the submission of bids. Defines "immaterial or technical information".	GVR, CPC, FIN

HB1913 RELATING TO CHILD VISITATION.

HHH. JHA

Requires a finding that denial of reasonable grandparent visitation rights would cause significant harm to a child as a condition of awarding grandparent visitation rights. Clarifies procedures for an order awarding reasonable grandparent visitation rights. Specifies that a violation of the terms and conditions of the order is punishable as contempt of court.

HB1914 RELATING TO SENSORY ROOMS.

EDN, FIN

Requires the department of education to construct and implement sensory rooms for children diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder in all public schools. Appropriates funds for the planning, design, and construction of the sensory rooms. Appropriates funds for special education teachers to staff the sensory rooms.

HB1915 RELATING TO AVIATION SAFETY.

TRN, CPC, FIN

Prohibits the installation and deployment of wireless facilities and any modified or replaced utility poles used for the collocation of small wireless facilities that use fifth-generation cellular network technology within a certain radius of state airports and navigational equipment.

<u>HB1916</u> RELATING TO VICTIM RESTITUTION.

JHA, FIN

Requires, when a defendant is convicted of negligent homicide in the first degree under section 707-702.5(1)(a), victim restitution to include financial support to raise the decedent's surviving minor children until each child reaches the age of eighteen, or until the age of twenty-three for any child who enrolls full-time in a college, university, vocational school, or trade school, in an amount to be determined by the court and to be paid to the person responsible for raising the children.

<u>HB1917</u> RELATING TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING.

HSG, JHA, FIN

Indefinitely extends the deadline for the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation to renegotiate an existing, or issue a new, ground lease for the Front Street Apartments affordable housing project before the corporation's requirement to initiate condemnation proceedings is triggered.

HB1918 RELATING TO ACCESS TO TREATMENT FOR

TERMINALLY ILL PATIENTS.

Codifies a terminally ill patient's right to try experimental

treatment options.

Requires reports to the legislature. Appropriates funds. HB1930 RELATING TO FISH AGGREGATION DEVICES. WAL, FIN Provides funds to the department of land and natural resources to support the deployment, replacement, and maintenance of fish aggregation devices. HB1931 RELATING TO MOSQUITO CONTROL. WAL, FIN Appropriates funds for the establishment of one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) planner position related to mosquito control in the department of land and natural resources. RELATING TO CHILD WELFARE SERVICES. HB1932 HHH, FIN Requires the child welfare services branch of the department of human services to establish a pilot program to develop a modern case management software solution compatible with existing child welfare technology. Appropriates funds. RELATING TO PERSONS WORKING WITH CHILDREN. HB1933 GVR, HHH, JHA Establishes rules of ethics applicable to persons who work with children pursuant to a contract with the State. Requires recommendations made to tribunals to base any factual findings on the relevant legal standard of proof applicable to the matter. Provides that the contracts of any person who violates the rules

of ethics are voidable on behalf of the State.

Requires the Department of Human Services to establish a neighbor islands blind and visually impaired service pilot program that provides training and other services to blind or visually impaired individuals residing on the neighbor islands. Requires the Department of Human Services to report to Legislature before the Regular Session of 2025. Appropriates funds. Repeals 06/30/2025. RELATING TO HEALTH INSURANCE. HB1946 HHH, CPC, FIN Requires all insurers in the state, including medicaid managed care programs, to cover annual mental health wellness examinations beginning 1/1/2023. EEP, CPC, FIN Requires the auditor to conduct a financial audit of the deposit beverage container program and the Department of Health's expenditures from the deposit beverage container deposit special fund. HB1965 RELATING TO PROPERTY FORFEITURE.

JHA, FIN

Restricts civil asset forfeiture to cases involving the commission of a covered offense where the person exercising some degree of control over the property is charged with an offense related to the property. Raises the State's standard for forfeiture to clear and convincing evidence. Authorizes the use of certain forfeited property by local or state agencies for a limited time. Directs forfeiture proceeds to certain involved state and local governments and to the general fund. Amends the allowable expenses for moneys in the criminal forfeiture fund. Amends the requirements for the attorney general to adopt rules and report on the Hawaii omnibus criminal forfeiture act. Effective 6/29/2022.

HB1966 RELATING TO SOLID WASTE.

EEP, WAL, FIN

Requires the one-half mile buffer zone between construction, modification, or expansion of a waste or disposal facility and a residential lot, school, or hospital to also apply to land designated as important agricultural lands and land within the agricultural district.

HB1967 RELATING TO WASTE OR DISPOSAL FACILITIES.

EEP, WAL, FIN

Prohibits the construction, modification, or expansion of any waste or disposal facility in agricultural districts and on important agricultural lands in counties with a population of five hundred thousand or more.

HB1968 RELATING TO WASTE OR DISPOSAL FACILITIES.

EEP, WAL, FIN

Prohibits the construction, modification, or expansion of any waste or disposal facility on land that covers a significant aquifer as determined by the department of health.

HB1969 RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

CPC, FIN

Mandates each county to offer a monetary reward to individuals who report the illegal use of fireworks and to pay the reward under certain conditions. Appropriates funds.

HB1970 RELATING TO WELLNESS.

HHH, FIN

Establishes a temporary Office of Wellness and Resilience within the Office of the Governor. Authorizes the Office to address issues and implement solutions to improve wellness and resilience, including issues and solutions identified by the Trauma-Informed Care Task Force. Appropriates moneys.

Sunsets on an unspecified date.

HB1971 RELATING TO PEER-TO-PEER CAR-SHARING. TRN, CPC, FIN Authorizes peer-to-peer car-sharing and establishes regulations thereof. Imposes the car-sharing surcharge tax on peer-to-peer car-sharing programs. Sets the car-sharing vehicle surcharge tax at a rate equal to one-twelfth of the rate of the rental motor vehicle surcharge tax. Requires those persons engaging or continuing in a peer-to-peer car-sharing program to register with the Department of Taxation. RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR FIN HB1972 THE BENEFIT OF THE TWENTY-SEVENTH REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT. Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects in the twenty-seventh representative district. RELATING TO SPORTS WAGERING. HB1973 ECD, CPC/JHA, Allows for the regulation of sports wagering by the department FIN of business, economic development, and tourism. Establishes licensing requirements for sports wagering operators and sports wagering suppliers. Specifies that sports wagering shall not be considered games of chance or gambling. HB1974 RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. GVR, CPC, FIN Establishes the small business assistance initiative within the state procurement office, to consist of a small business procurement coordinator and small business office. Appropriates funds. RELATING TO HEALTHCARE PRECEPTORS. HB1975 HHH, CPC, FIN Amends the definition of "preceptor" and "volunteer-based supervised clinical training rotation" to improve accessibility for providers to receive income tax credits for acting as preceptors. Includes the Director of Health on the Preceptor Credit Assurance Committee. RELATING TO HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS. HB1976 PDP, CPC, FIN Establishes the safe home program to provide matching and nonmatching grants for installation of wind resistive devices to single-family, owner-occupied, residential properties in certain circumstances. Creates a permanent position within the insurance division of the department of commerce and consumer affairs to implement and administer the safe home program. Appropriates funds. RELATING TO DENTAL ASSISTANTS. HB1977 HHH, CPC, FIN Allows dental assistants to perform limited duties under general

supervision of a dentist in public health settings.

Committee REFERRAL HB1978 RELATING TO THE HAWAII PROPERTY INSURANCE CPC ASSOCIATION. Short form bill relating to the Hawaii Property Insurance Association. HB1979 RELATING TO HABITAT CONSERVATION PLANS. WAL, JHA Requires any person, before engaging in an activity with a high likelihood of resulting in an incidental take of a threatened or endangered species, to enter into a planning process with DLNR for the purpose of preparing and implementing a habitat conservation plan. Requires habitat conservation plans to include additional components. HB1980 RELATING TO TELEPHONIC SERVICES. HHH, CPC, FIN Permits, but does not require, Medicaid, insurance providers, and health maintenance organizations to cover telephonic behavioral health services under certain circumstances. Clarifies that telephonic services do not constitute telehealth. HB1981 RELATING TO THE PUPUKEA MARINE LIFE WAL/LAT, FIN CONSERVATION DISTRICT. Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to establish and conduct the Pupukea marine life conservation district carrying capacity pilot program. Appropriates moneys.

HB1982 RELATING TO TAXES.

ECD, FIN

Establishes a tax withholding requirement for all payments to loan-out companies for services performed in Hawaii for persons claiming the motion picture, digital media, and film production income tax credit. Prohibits the defense of erroneous claim for refund or credit if the claim for refund was generated by a tax credit. Sets the penalty for the erroneous claim for refund or credit generated by a tax credit at ten per cent. Requires taxpayers claiming the motion picture, digital media, and film production income tax credit to submit a sworn statement and verification review to the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism only if qualified production costs exceed \$1,000,000. Requires reports by the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism to the Legislature on the motion picture, digital media, and film production income tax credit to identify the dollar amount claimed, name of company, and name of program claiming the credit. Extends the period during which excess credits may be claimed to December 31, 2032. Requires qualified taxpayers claiming the motion picture, digital media, and film production income tax credit to withhold a certain amount and remit that amount within thirty calendar days to the Department of Taxation to the credit of the general excise tax account of the loan-out company. Amends the uses of the Tax Administration Special Fund.

HB1983

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM.

Establishes the state film coordinator in the department of business, economic development, and tourism to review, approve, and issue permits to film in the State. Appropriates funds.

HB1984

RELATING TO SUBSTANCES APPLIED ON STATE PROPERTY.

Establishes a list of substances allowed for use as pesticides and fertilizers on state property. Provides that the use of substances not specifically allowed as pesticides and fertilizers on state property is prohibited, unless certain exceptions, a waiver, or exemption apply. Requires a state department or agency seeking a waiver to apply to the department of agriculture. Effective July 1, 2023.

HB1985 RELATING TO LIMITATIONS ON MANDATORY HHH/LAT, CPC

OVERTIME FOR NURSES.

Establishes limitations on mandatory and voluntary overtime for registered nurses and licensed practical nurses. Effective

1/1/2023.

HB1986 RELATING TO THE BOARD OF EDUCATION. EDN, JHA

Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects in the

HB2242 RELATING TO FERTILITY PRESERVATION. HHH, CPC, FIN

Requires insurers, mutual benefit societies, and health maintenance organizations to provide coverage for fertility preservation procedures for those who have been diagnosed with cancer and whose cancer or cancer treatment may adversely

affect their fertility.

Establishes within the Department of Human Services a 4-year pilot program to provide housing and child care vouchers to qualified applicants who will soon complete, or have recently completed, a term of imprisonment as a sentenced offender, and who have or will have sole or primary custody of 1 or more children under the age of 18. Requires a voucher recipient to be employed at least 20 hours per week or be employed and attend an educational program for a combined total of at least 20 hours per week. Requires reports to the Legislature. Appropriates moneys.

<u>HB2260</u> RELATING TO CANNABIS.

HHH, CPC, FIN

Amends the circumstances under which medical cannabis may be transported by and between dispensaries. Increases the allowable number of plants for production centers. Increases the number of production centers that may be allowed under a dispensary license. Increases the number of retail dispensing locations that may be allowed under a dispensary license. Redefines the term "medical cannabis production center" to include any series of structures located within the same secured perimeter fence-line. Requires the Department of Health to establish the fee structure for the submission of applications for additional production centers and retail dispensing locations and for dispensary-to-dispensary sales. Authorizes a non-registered qualifying patient to engage in the medical use of cannabis for a period of one year from the date of the issuance of a medical provider's certification letter, subject to certain conditions.

HB2262 RELATING TO WATER RATIONING.

WAL, CPC, FIN

Establishes an income tax credit for water rationing systems.

HB2263 RELATING TO WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT.

WAL/EEP/HHH,

CPC, FIN

Facilitates the jurisdiction transfer of water quality management, water pollution, wastewater treatment, instream flow standards, and applications for water quality from the Department of Health to the Commission on Water Resource Management.

RELATING TO THE COUNTIES.

JHA, CPC, FIN

Authorizes the counties to adopt ordinances to legalize non-medical marijuana possession, sale, transfer, and use for adults, subject to certain conditions. Appropriates funds to DOE to install air conditioning units for public school classrooms that have not received air conditioning units.

HB2268 RELATING TO PESTICIDES.

AGR, JHA, CPC

Requires the department of agriculture to submit an annual report to the legislature on pesticide inspections and compliance investigations, including location, type, and enforcement action taken, conducted in the preceding year. For the first violation of the pesticide law by commercial and private pesticide applicators, eliminates the written warning penalty prior to imposition of stricter penalties. Increases monetary fines for pesticide violations.

HB2269 RELATING TO POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION.

HET, FIN

Establishes a pilot program to offer tuition waivers for certain community college students starting in fall 2023. Requires the Board of Regents of the University of Hawaii to submit a report.

HB2270 RELATING TO THE BOARD OF LAND AND NATURAL

WAL, JHA

RESOURCES.

Requires at least 1 member of the Board of Land and Natural Resources to have demonstrated knowledge of, and experience with, the State's boating and fishing communities, including knowledge of ocean conservation and traditional fishing rights. Requires the member representing the boating and fishing communities to be recommended by a statewide fishing organization for the Governor's nomination and appointment.

HB2271 RELATING TO ASSISTANCE ANIMALS.

HSG, JHA

Defines "assistance animal" for purposes of the State's fair housing laws. Clarifies the type of verification a person with a disability must provide to request an assistance animal as a

reasonable housing accommodation.

HB2272 RELATING TO CONDOMINIUM ASSOCIATIONS.

CPC

Permits sixty-seven per cent of unit owners to amend a condominium declaration. Requires developers to include annual reserve contributions based on a reserve study. Clarifies time and date requirements for petitions to amend bylaws and call for special meetings; electronic, machine, and mail voting during periods of emergency; time frame for approval of minutes; and board meeting participation. Requires a condominium association's reserve study to be performed by an independent, certified reserve specialist and prepared or updated at least every three years.

RELATING TO FIREWORKS. HB2273

CPC, FIN

Specifies that certain violations of the Fireworks Control Law shall be considered a violation of noise control rules under the Hawaii noise pollution laws, punishable by civil penalties and subject to citations under those respective laws. Appropriates funds to establish one full-time equivalent position for an inspector in the department of health. Appropriates funds for the department of health to enter into a contract with a security company to assist the inspector.

HB2274 RELATING TO UNDERGROUND FUEL STORAGE TANKS. HHH/EEP, CPC

Prohibits issuance of future underground fuel storage tanks within one-half mile of an aquifer beginning July 1, 2022. Prohibits operation of and renewal of underground fuel storage tank permits located within one-half mile from an aquifer beginning January 1, 2050. Defines underground fuel storage tanks as any fuel tank with a capacity of one hundred gallons or more.

RELATING TO FIREWORKS INFRACTIONS. HB2275

CPC, FIN

Establishes an expeditious adjudication system for the processing of fireworks infractions. Appropriates funds.

RELATING TO INVASIVE SPECIES. HB2276

WAL, FIN

Appropriates funds to the department of transportation for the coordinated removal of albizia trees on public and private property, including other trees that potentially threaten the public roadways and utility infrastructure. Requires a two-to-one matching requirement from a public utilities source.

HB2277 RELATING TO EDUCATION.

EDN, FIN

Appropriates moneys to promote surfing as an interscholastic sport.

HB2278 RELATING TO ENERGY.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Establishes a refundable income tax credit to mitigate the effect

of a carbon emissions tax on taxpayers. Amends the

environmental response, energy, and food security tax to address

carbon emissions.

HB2279 RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR

THE BENEFIT OF THE TWENTY-FOURTH

Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects in the

twenty-fourth representative district.

HB2280 RELATING TO REAL PROPERTY. AGR, CPC

Specifies that planned community associations cannot prohibit or unreasonably restrict the use of a unit owner's enclosed yard area

for personal agriculture.

HB2281 RELATING TO PLANNED COMMUNITY ASSOCIATIONS. CPC, JHA

Specifies that a director's failure to disclose a conflict of interest shall constitute a breach of the director's duty of loyalty and the director may be automatically removed from the board, liable to the association for monetary damages, and disqualified from

future service on the board.

HB2282 RELATING TO ASSOCIATION FEES. CPC

Requires the breakdown of the annual maintenance fees in developer's public reports to include annual reserve contributions based on a reserve study. Redefines "cash flow plan" to mean a minimum thirty-year projection of a condominium association's future income and expense requirements to fund fully its replacement reserves requirements each year, except for

FEMALE OFFENDERS.

Requires the Department of Public Safety to develop and conduct a pretrial female risk and needs assessment tool to measure the female offender's risk to flight, reoffend, or harm the community, and shall consider factors important to women when considering their risk to reoffend and treatment needs.

HB2397 HET, CPC, FIN Establishes the Hawaii broadband infrastructure authority. Defines broadband equity within the Hawaii broadband and

digital equity office. Appropriates federal funds.

HB2398 RELATING TO LANDFILLS.

EEP, WAL, CPC

Reduces the landfill buffer zone from one-half mile to onequarter mile.

HB2399 RELATING TO WASTE MANAGEMENT.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Establishes an extended producer responsibility program. Requires certain producers of fast-moving consumer goods to register with the Department of Health and pay an annual fee based on the amount of packaging volume the covered producer places on the market each calendar year from 2023 to 2027. Provides for the deposit of fees into an extended producer responsibility special fund. Provides for the expenditure of moneys from the extended producer responsibility special fund for the creation of a report that assess the resources needed to reduce the volume of packaging waste sent to landfills or power plants that burn municipal solid waste as a fuel by 50% by 2026 and 80% by 2030. Appropriates moneys.

HB2400 RELATING TO PSILOCYBIN.

HHH, CPC

Establishes the therapeutic psilocybin working group to examine the medicinal and therapeutic effects of psilocybin and develop a long-term strategic plan to ensure the availability of therapeutic psilocybin or psilocybin-based products that are safe, accessible, and affordable for adults 21 years of age or older.

HB2401 RELATING TO QUALITY SCHOOLS.

EDN/LAT, FIN

Establishes a shortage differential salary incentive program within the department of education to provide shortage differential pay for teachers working in special education, hard-to-staff locations, and Hawaiian immersion positions. Provides automatic step increases in teacher salaries for each year of satisfactory service completed by public school teachers. Increases the amount of time available to teachers for planning, preparation, and collaboration.

HB2402 RELATING TO ASSISTANCE FOR NEW BUSINESSES.

ECD, GVR, CPC

Requires DBEDT to provide support services to new businesses. Establishes a separate general excise tax rate for a business's first five years of operation. Exempts a business from paying any fees related to licensing and registration within its first five years of operation. Allows individuals to continue to receive unemployment benefits while in the process of starting a business. Requires the state procurement office to advise government bodies to allocate at least five percent of funding to procure goods and services from new businesses in the State. Prohibits savings and loan associations from requiring a signed confession of judgment from a small business as a condition of receiving a loan.

HB2403 RELATING TO CONTRACTORS.

LAT, CPC, FIN

Allows the department of labor and industrial relations to train and deputize volunteer investigators investigating public works projects. Requires reports to the legislature. Appropriates funds.

<u>HB2404</u> RELATING TO COMPACTS OF FREE ASSOCIATION.

CAI, FIN

Creates a task force to conduct a census of COFA residents in

Hawaii.

<u>HB2405</u> RELATING TO INSURANCE.

HHH, CPC

Prohibits health insurance companies from denying coverage on the basis of gender identity if the policy covers the treatment for purposes other than gender transition. Requires insurance companies to provide applicants and insured persons with clear information about the coverage of gender transition services, including the process for appealing a claim denied on the basis of medical necessity.

HB2406 RELATING TO TAXATION.

ECD, FIN

Makes the state earned income tax credit refundable and permanent. Allows nonrefundable state earned income tax credits claimed for certain taxable years that exceeded tax liability for the original claim year to be credited against net tax liability in subsequent years until exhausted, up to the end of the

2022 tax year.

<u>HB2407</u> RELATING TO FAMILY LEAVE.

LAT, CPC, FIN

Provides employees with up to eight weeks of paid family leave during the first year after birth of the individual's child, adoption of a child by the individual, or placement of a child with the individual through foster care, and eight weeks of paid family leave to care for the individual's family member with a serious health condition during any benefit year, paid through an employer-based private insurance program currently used to provide for temporary disability benefits. Repeals chapter 398, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Appropriates funds to the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations.

HB2408 RELATING TO MINIMUM WAGE.

LAT, FIN

Beginning 7/1/2027, and each year thereafter, requires DLIR to annually adjust the minimum wage hourly rate and tip credit amount for the following January 1 based on a three-year average of the consumer price index of all urban consumers.

HB2409 RELATING TO THE ECONOMY.

ECD, FIN

Establishes a public policy framework that addresses state goals in the areas of economic disaster mitigation, economic diversification, import substitution, and community development. Appropriates moneys to the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism to implement specific projects that address those goals. Identifies additional projects authorized in the executive budget to be implemented by the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism in furtherance of those goals. Requires DBEDT to submit annual reports to the Legislature summarizing project outcomes, including an assessment of each project's effectiveness in achieving those goals.

HB2410

RELATING TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SERVICES. HET, CPC

Establishes a technology services consolidation working group, which shall develop a plan for the phased consolidation of all state executive branch information technology services and staff within five years, except those of the Department of Education, Hawaii Health Systems Corporation, and University of Hawaii, under the Office of Enterprise Technology Services. Requires the working group to recommend ways to attract high quality information technology professionals to the State.

HB2411 RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

GVR, CPC, FIN

Establishes a procurement services consolidation working group, which shall develop a plan for the phased consolidation of all state executive branch procurement services and staff within five years, except those of the Department of Education, Hawaii Health Systems Corporation, and University of Hawaii, under the State Procurement Office. Requires the working group to recommend ways to attract high quality procurement professionals to the State. Appropriates moneys.

HB2412 RELATING TO TOURISM.

LAT, FIN

Establishes the kuleana special fund to support the preservation of natural, cultural, and environmental resources that are impacted by the tourism industry. Requires the Hawaii tourism authority to create educational videos and informational material and coordinate with government entities, organizations, and private businesses to market and disseminate the videos and material to everyone arriving in the State. Appropriates funds. Sunsets 06/30/2027.

HB2413 RELATING TO STATE PARKS.

WAL, FIN

Requires the department of land and natural resources to conduct a feasibility study on a revenue generating and management system of user fees for Hawaii's state parks and to submit a report to the legislature.

HB2414 RELATING TO GENERAL EXCISE TAX EXEMPTIONS.

ECD, FIN

Establishes a general excise tax exemption for the gross proceeds or income from the manufacture, production, packaging, and sale of diapers.

HB2415 RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR FIN

THE BENEFIT OF THE FORTY-EIGHTH

REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT.

Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects in the fortyeighth representative district.

<u>HB2416</u> RELATING TO CAMPAIGN SPENDING.

GVR, JHA

Informs the public of the true sources of dark money contributions by requiring "persons," which includes 501(c)(4) organizations, to disclose the name and address of donors who donate an aggregate of more than \$100, with certain exceptions.

Requires a portion of the moneys deposited into the State Parks Special Fund to be allocated to the Department of Land and Natural Resources and Office of Planning and Sustainable Development based on the percentage of residents who have a favorable perception towards Hawaii's tourism industry as reported in the most recent Hawaii Tourism Authority resident sentiment survey results. Increases the sum to be appropriated out of the State Parks Special Fund by \$12,000,000 for fiscal year 2022-2023 to be expended by the Department of Land and Natural Resources, in conjunction with the Office of Planning and Sustainable Development.

ECD, FIN

Creates the Hawaii Start-up Business Loan Program to be administered by the Business Development and Support Division of the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism, in coordination with the Hawaii Technology Development Corporation. Establishes the Hawaii Start-up Business Loan Program Special Fund. Makes an appropriation.

HB2440 RELATING TO PUBLIC WORKS.

LAT, JHA

Imposes penalty on both the person and firm upon finding of repeat violations of state law governing wages and hours of employees on public works.

LAT, FIN Requires the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism to establish a grant program to offer matching funds to public-private partnerships in eligible industries to engage in workforce development. Amends various provisions relating to the dedication of infrastructure to a county. RELATING TO VOLUNTEER MONTH. HB2445 CAI, JHA Designates the month of April as Volunteer Month; provided that the month is not construed as a state holiday. RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND HB2446 WAL, FIN NATURAL RESOURCES. Appropriates moneys to the Department of Land and Natural

Resources for establishing 28.0 FTE positions in parks administration and operation (LNR 806) to implement visitor reservation systems in Hawaii state parks. Appropriates additional moneys to the Department of Land and Natural Resources from the state parks special fund for purposes of state

HB2447 RELATING TO SAFETY.

LAT, CPC, FIN

Establishes a new regulatory regime for boiler inspectors and elevator inspectors, including the creation of a boiler and elevator inspectors board. Transfers the regulation of boiler inspectors and elevator inspectors from the department of labor and industrial relations to the board. Clarifies that any inspection required under the Boiler and Elevator Safety Law, including inspections required to be done by the department, may be directed to be completed by licensed qualified boiler inspectors or licensed qualified elevator inspectors.

RELATING TO A STATEWIDE DATA HUB. HB2448

LAT, CPC, FIN

Requires the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations to establish and maintain a statewide data hub to collect employer and employee data. Creates positions. Appropriates funds.

HB2449 RELATING TO THE HAWAII STATE ARCHIVES.

CAI, JHA, FIN

Appropriates funds to establish staff positions in the Hawaii state archives to assist with its mission and increase public access to historical documents and artifacts. Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds to finance the construction of an additional building to address the current and future facility needs of the state archives. Requires all departments, offices, and agencies of the State to conduct an inventory of all documents in their possession related to the culture and history of Hawaii and Native Hawaiians. Requires the state archives to develop a transfer plan to acquire those documents.

RELATING TO PUBLIC LAND TRUST REVENUES. HB2450

WAL, JHA, FIN

Requires that all funds in the administratively established carryforward trust holding account in excess of \$15,100,000 be transferred to the Office of Hawaiian Affairs each year.

RELATING TO VITAL STATISTICS. HB2451

Beginning 01/01/2023, adds the gender marker "X" as a third gender option on birth certificates and permits individuals to submit an application for a change in sex designation on their birth certificates that reflects this third gender option.

RELATING TO HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS. HB2452

JHA. FIN

Authorizes the election of the members of the Hawaiian Homes Commission. Establishes the elected office of Director of Hawaiian Home Lands, the holder of which shall have administrative oversight over the Department of Hawaiian Home

Requires the court and the prosecution to take appropriate action to ensure a prompt trial in order to minimize the length of time a child abuse victim or minor witness must endure the stress of the proceedings.

HB2462 RELATING TO VITAL STATISTICS.

HHH, CPC

Requires the department of health to issue a certificate of stillbirth, upon request of the parent or parents named on a fetal death certificate issued in the case of a stillbirth. Appropriates funds.

HB2463 RELATING TO THE RIGHT TO EXIT THE SEX TRADE.

HHH, JHA, FIN

Establishes a 1-year pilot program within the Department of Human Services to provide a basic monthly income of \$2,000 for up to 1 year, to qualified persons who are verified victims of sex trafficking, or who are female or sexual and gender minority individuals seeking to exit the sex trade. Requires the Department to keep confidential the personal information of applicants and program participants. Appropriates moneys. Requires report to the Legislature.

HB2464 RELATING TO USE OF FORCE IN SELF-PROTECTION.

JHA

Clarifies when the use of deadly force is not justified.

<u>HB2465</u> RELATING TO DOMESTIC ABUSE.

ННН, ЈНА

Repeals referral and reporting requirements for the Family Courts and the Department of Human Services that apply to cases in which a temporary restraining order is sought for alleged domestic abuse involving an incapacitated or minor family or

household member.

<u>HB2466</u> RELATING TO TARO.

AGR, ECD, FIN

Establishes an exemption from state income tax for the first \$100,000 of income derived from taro, taro products, and land used to produce taro if the total amount of land used to cultivate taro in Hawaii does not exceed thirty thousand acres at any point in the year.

HB2467

RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION ACT.

WAL, JHA, FIN

Defines "beneficiary consultation". Prohibits the department of Hawaiian home lands from disposing or extending a general lease to non-beneficiaries unless there are no applicants seeking to enter into a general lease to the use and occupancy of a tract of Hawaiian home lands. Requires the department to notify beneficiaries through beneficiary consultation prior to the disposition of Hawaiian home lands. Prohibits the department from establishing additional criteria to enter into a general lease with an applicant, under certain conditions. Specifies that the department may grant a license or enter into a general lease, under certain conditions. Allocates the interest or other earnings from the Hawaiian home loan fund and Hawaiian home general loan fund into their respective funds, under certain conditions. Requires the department to submit a quarterly report to the legislature and beneficiaries. Authorizes the department to negotiate with homestead association governed water agencies to maintain water systems prior to other service providers, under certain conditions.

HB2468

RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR FIN THE BENEFIT OF THE FORTY-THIRD REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT.

Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects in the fortythird representative district.

HB2469

RELATING TO THE UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION LAT, CPC, FIN TRUST FUND.

Establishes an unemployment compensation insolvency special fund to be expended solely to resolve an unemployment compensation trust fund insolvency emergency declared by the Governor. Permits the Governor to declare an unemployment compensation trust fund insolvency emergency and to expend moneys from the fund if the Director of Finance determines that the fund balance is insufficient to meet the State's obligations. Appropriates moneys into the unemployment compensation insolvency special fund.

HB2470 RELATING TO GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS.

WAL/ECD, JHA, FIN

Establishes the Director of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism, or a designee of the Director, as an ex-officio, voting member of the Hawaii Tourism Authority and the School Facilities Authority Board. Transfers the Stadium Authority and the School Facilities Authority from the Department of Accounting and General Services and Department of Education, respectively, to the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism. Requires that administrative expenses incurred for the stadium development special fund be deducted. Increases the amount of general obligation bonds that may be issued for the Stadium Development District.

HB2471 RELATING TO THE ADEQUATE RESERVE FUND.

LAT, CPC, FIN

Amends the definition of "adequate reserve fund" to exclude the benefit cost rate from June 2020 through August 2021, effective for calendar years 2023 through 2030.

HB2472 RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR

FIN

THE BENEFIT OF THE FOURTEENTH, FIFTEENTH, AND SIXTEENTH REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICTS.

Authorizes issuance of general obligation bonds and appropriates funds for capital improvement projects for the benefit of the 14th, 15th, and 16th Representative Districts.

HB2473 RELATING TO OFFENDERS.

CMV, JHA, FIN

Transfers responsibility for vocational, educational, cultural, and other programming and services for offenders from the Department of Public Safety to the Judiciary and makes necessary conforming amendments to relevant statutory provisions. Requires the Judiciary to submit a report to the 2023 Legislature. Appropriates moneys.
