The Department of Transportation (DOT) is in **strong support** of the nomination of William Hankins to the State Highway Safety Council (SHSC).

Chapter 286-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, establishes the SHSC which advises the Governor on matters relating to the programs and activities of the state in the field of highway safety. The state has adjusted the makeup of the committee from a group that was primarily government officials and safety advocates, to one that includes cross sections of all users of the highway system in our community. We believe the Gubernatorial Nominees will bring knowledge, experience and passion that will add tremendously to a council that will advise the department on eliminating roadway fatalities while modernizing the system to meet the current and future needs of our state.

Mr. Hankins recently retired from the Maui Police Department (MPD) after over 30 years of service. Most of his experience has been in the Traffic Division at MPD, of which he was the commander for the last three years. He led efforts to curb impaired driving and worked closely with the community to address, deter, and change legislation with regard to impaired driving. Mr. Hankins even made national news with his clever slogans to get drivers to follow speed limits on Maui highways.

Additionally, due to his years of service at MPD, he was qualified in 2<sup>nd</sup> district court as an expert in the field of impaired driving and as a certified Drug Recognition expert. Most recently, he supported and worked with families to organize impaired driving sign waving events to bring much needed awareness to this issue. Mr. Hankins also created the annual Hanna Brown Memorial impaired driving checkpoint.

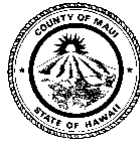


